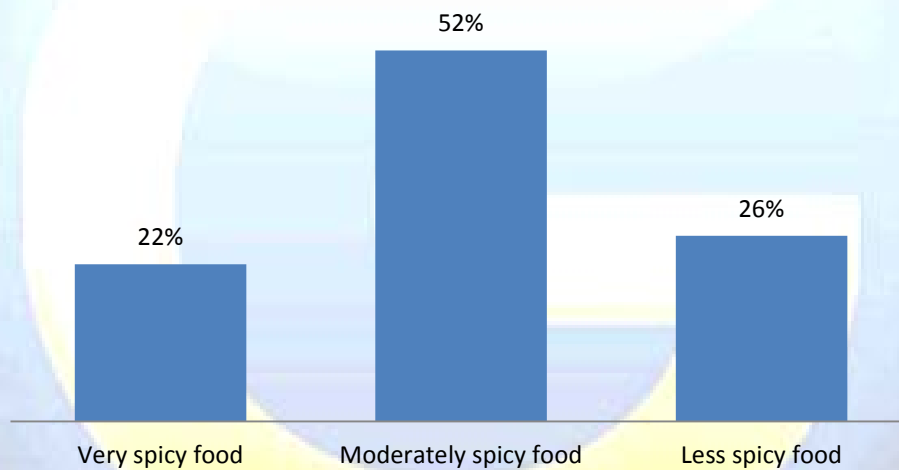
52 % Pakistanis prefer moderately spicy food; 22 % prefer very spicy food. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 52% Pakistanis prefer moderately spicy food, 22% prefer very spicy food.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people like very spicy food while others like less spicy food. What do you like?” In response to this question, 22% said very spicy food, 52% said moderately spicy food and 26% said less spicy food.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1851 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 12 – September 19, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
