A significant majority of Pakistanis (67%) believe management of cleanliness in their area's mosque is better compared to their area in general. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, December 26, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, a significant majority of Pakistanis (67%) believe management of cleanliness in their area's mosque is better compared to their area in general.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Compared to your area, how is the management of cleanliness in your area's mosque?" In response to this question, 67% said it is better, 14% said it is worse and 19% said it is the same.

Rural Urban Breakdown:

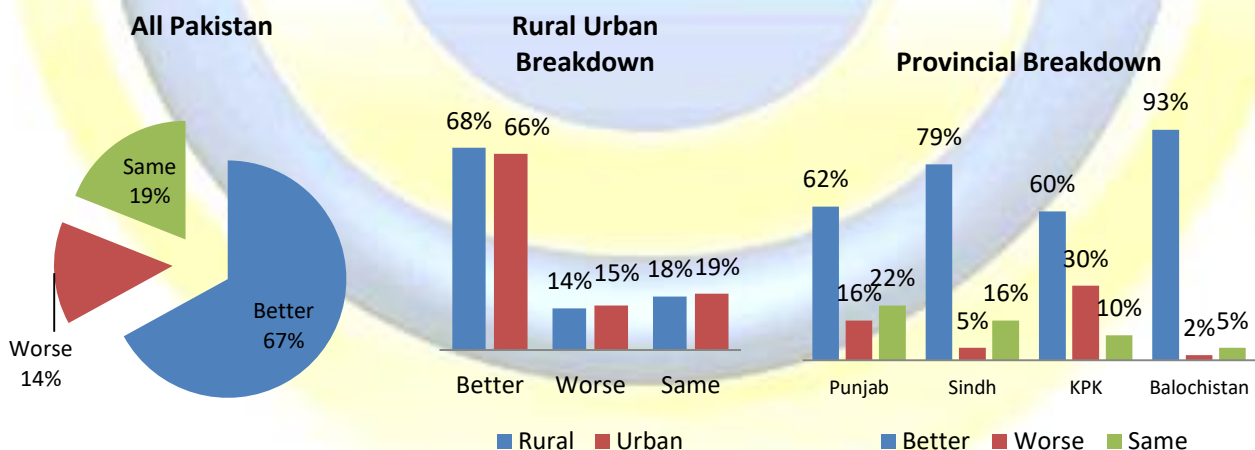
Insignificant rural-urban difference was seen in the results.

Provincial Breakdown:

In Punjab, 62% said better, 16% said worse and 22% said same. In Sindh, 79% said better, 5% said worse and 16% said same. In KPK, 60% said better, 30% said worse and 10% said same. In Balochistan, 93% said better, 2% said worse and 5% said same.

The results show that holistically across all four provinces, majority believe cleanliness in their area's mosque is better than that of the area in general.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1771 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 19– September 26, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
