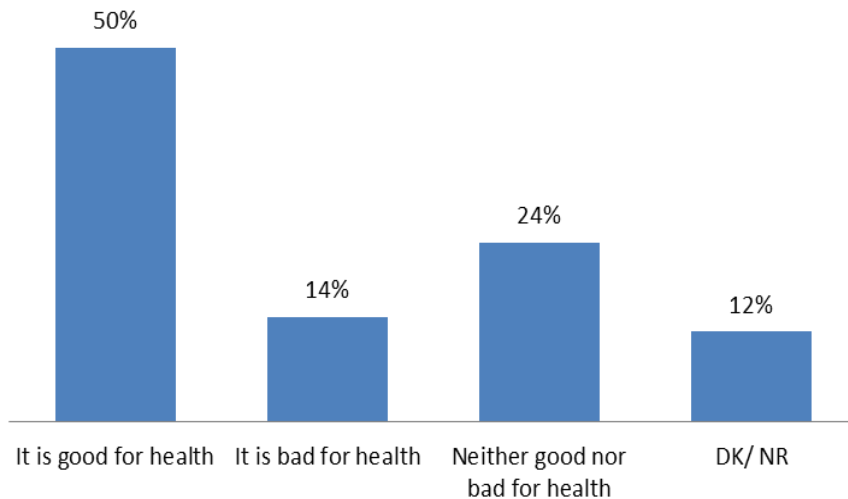

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 50% Pakistanis believe iodized salt is good for health.

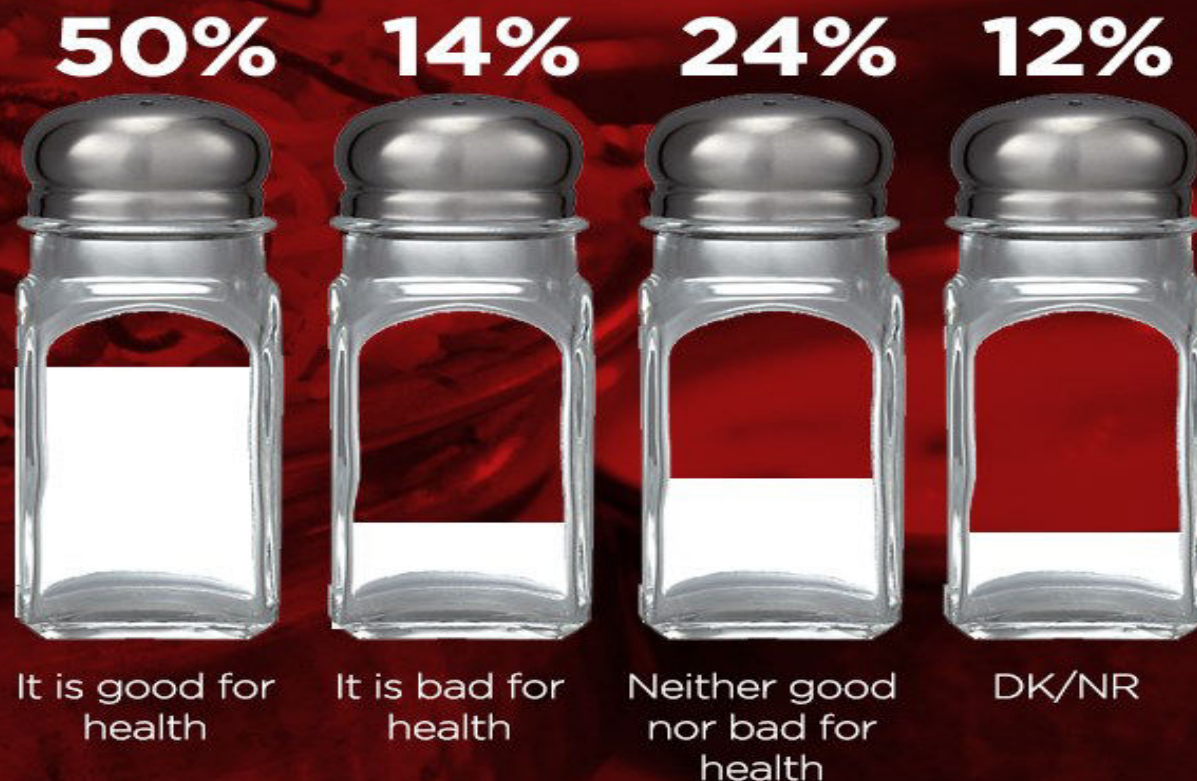
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “In your opinion, is iodine mixed salt good or bad for health?” In response to this question, 50% said it is good for health, 14% said it is bad for health and 24% said neither good nor bad for health. 12% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1892 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 29 – September 5, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 6% decrease in the proportion of Pakistanis who use iodized salt daily over the last 8 years.

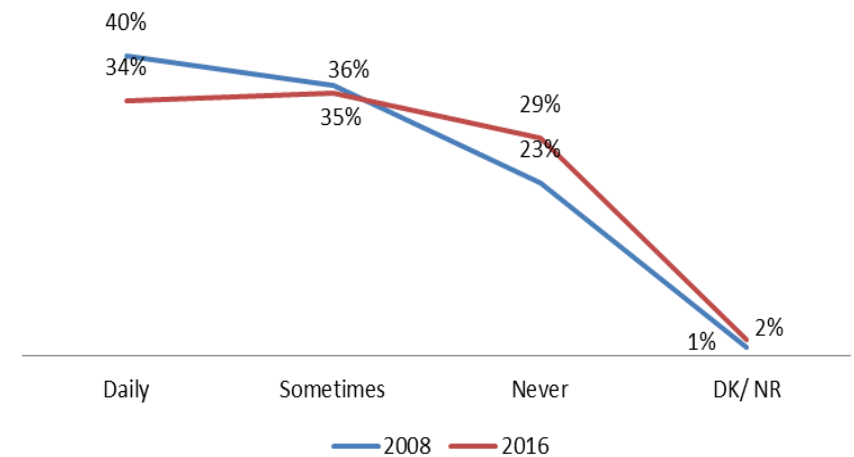
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “Do you use iodine mixed salt daily, sometimes or never?” In response to this question, 34% said daily, 35% said sometimes, 29% said never. 2% did not know or did not respond.

Trend Analysis

The same question was asked in 2008. In 2008, 40% said daily, 36% said sometimes, 23% said never. 1% did not know or did not respond.

In recent years, there has been a 6% decrease in the proportion of Pakistanis who consume iodized salt daily, a 1% decrease in the proportion of Pakistanis who use iodized salt sometimes and a 6% increase in the proportion of Pakistanis who never use iodized salt.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1892 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 29 – September 5, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

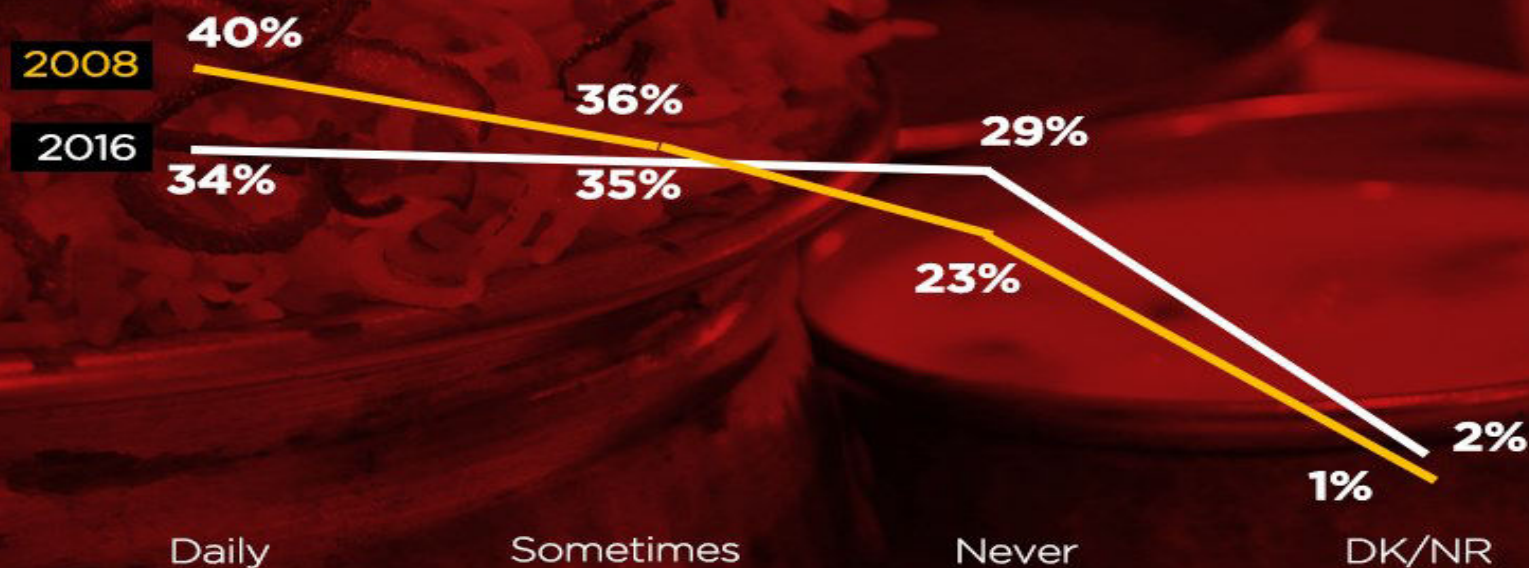

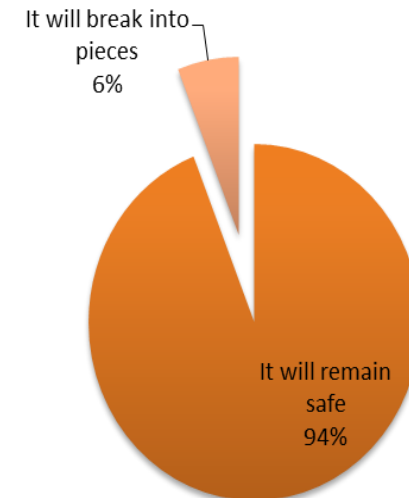

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1828 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 22 – August 29, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

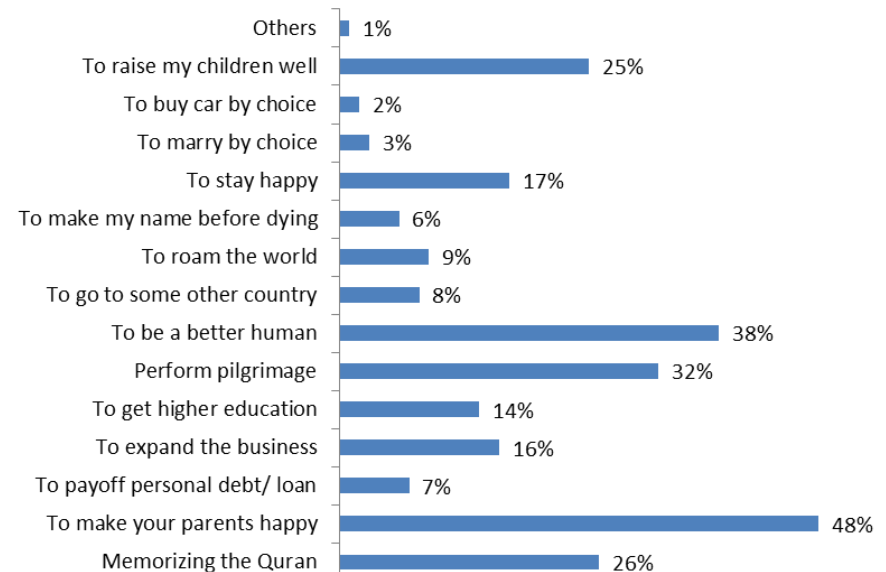
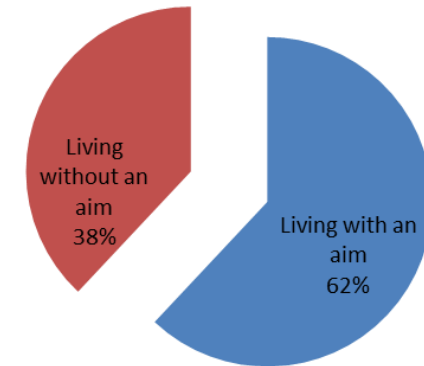

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority Pakistanis (62%) say that they live their life with an aim. For 48% Pakistanis making their parents happy is their life's aim; 38% say to be a better human being.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Kindly tell us are you living your life with an aim, or living your life the way it is without an aim?" In response to this question, 62% said they are living their life with an aim, 38% said they are living without an aim.

Those who responded they live with an aim (1220) were further asked, "If living for an aim, please tell what is the aim of your life?" In response to this question, 26% said to memorize the Quran, 48% said to make their parents happy, 7% said to payoff personal debt/loan, 16% said to expand the business, 14% said to get higher education, 32% said to perform pilgrimage, 38% to be a better human, 8% said to go to some other country, 9% said to roam the world, 6% said to make my name before dying, 17% said to stay happy, 3% said to marry by choice, 2% said to buy car by choice, 25% said to raise my children well, 1% said others.

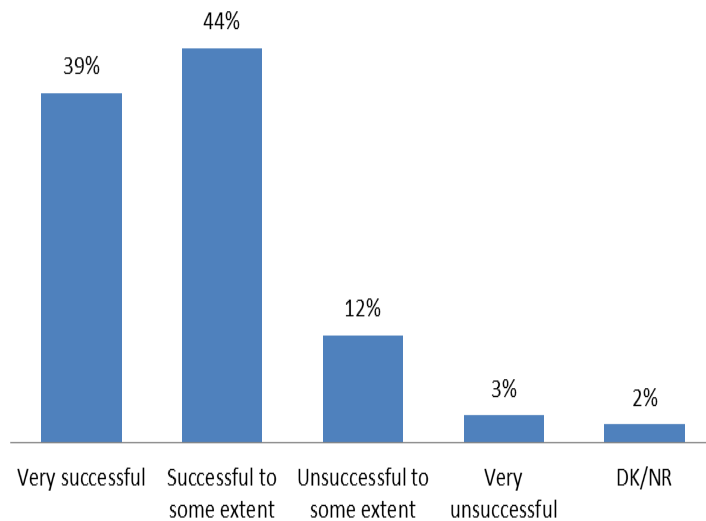

In response to this question, 39% said very successful, 44% said successful to some extent, 12% said unsuccessful to some extent, 3% said very unsuccessful. 2% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1846 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 5 – September 12, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

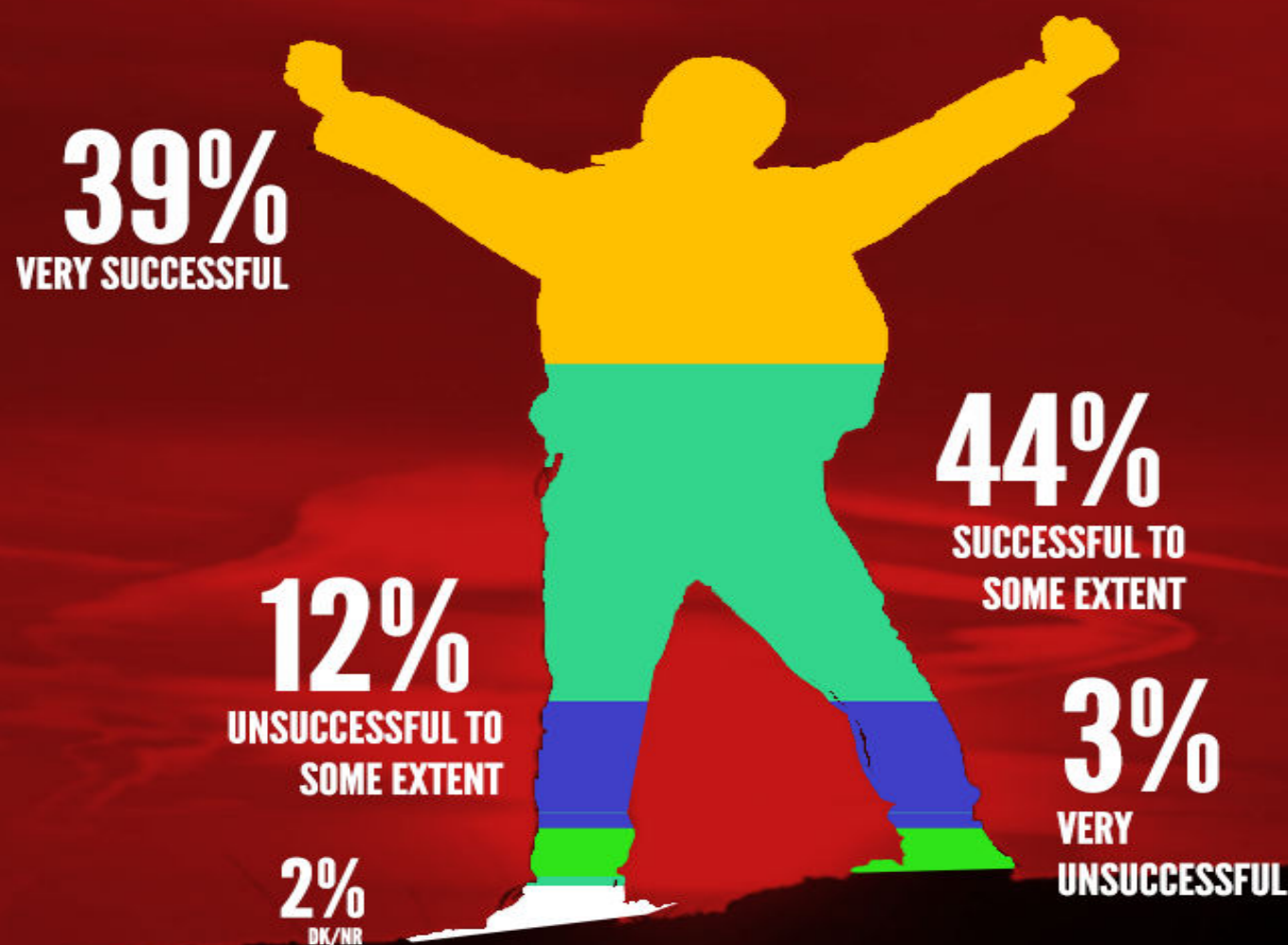
