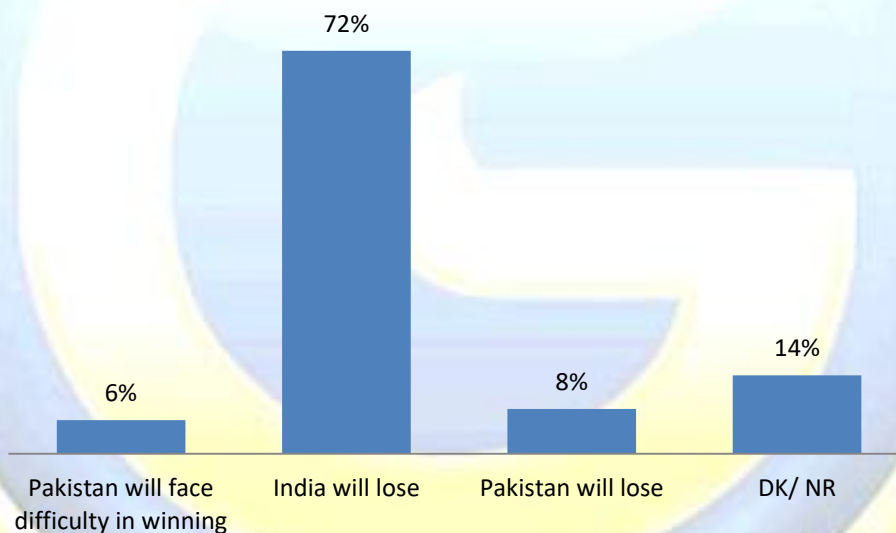
72% Pakistanis believe that if war erupts between India and Pakistan, India will lose, while 8% say that Pakistan will lose. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 72% Pakistanis believe that if war erupts between India and Pakistan, India will lose, while 8% say that Pakistan will lose.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “If war erupts between India and Pakistan, in your opinion what will be the result?” In response to this question, 6% said Pakistan will face difficulty in winning, 72% said India will lose, 8% said Pakistan will lose. 14% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1835 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 26– October 3, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
