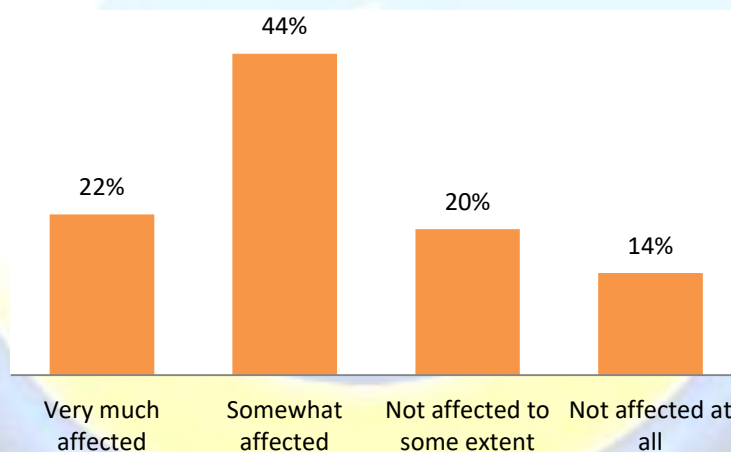
66% Pakistanis claim they were affected (very much or somewhat) due to closure of mobile network during Muharram. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 66% Pakistanis claim they were affected (very much or somewhat) due to closure of mobile network during Muharram.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Recently, the government shut down mobile networks because of Muharram. To what extent were you personally affected by this?” In response to this question, 22% said very much affected, 44% said somewhat affected, 20% said not affected to some extent while 14% said not affected at all.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1872 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 17– October 24, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm$ 2-3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
