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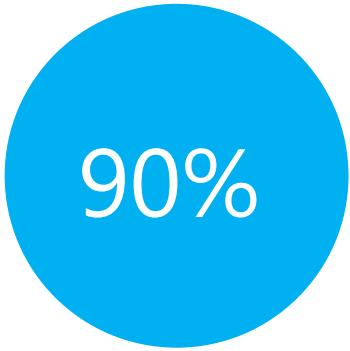

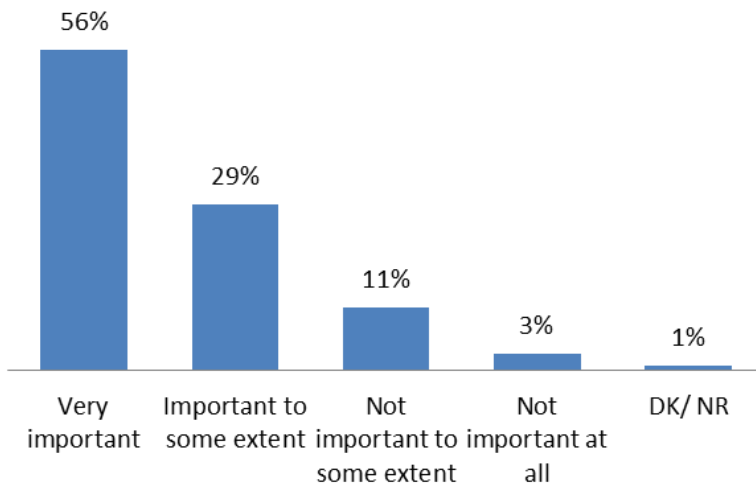

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 85% Pakistanis believe CPEC is important (very much or somewhat) for Pakistan's development.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "In your opinion, how important is China Pakistan Economic Corridor for Pakistan's development?" In response to this question, 56% said very important, 29% said important to some extent, 11% said not important to some extent, 3% said not important at all. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1872 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 17–October 24, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

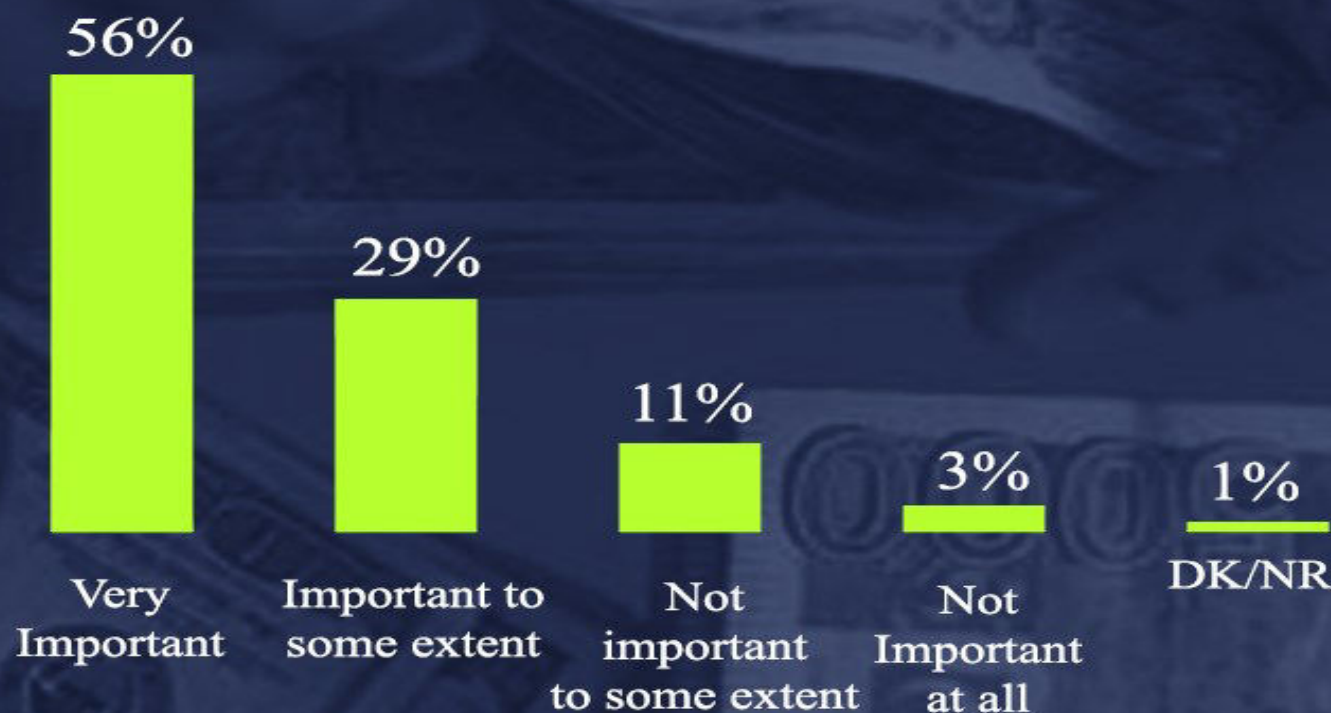

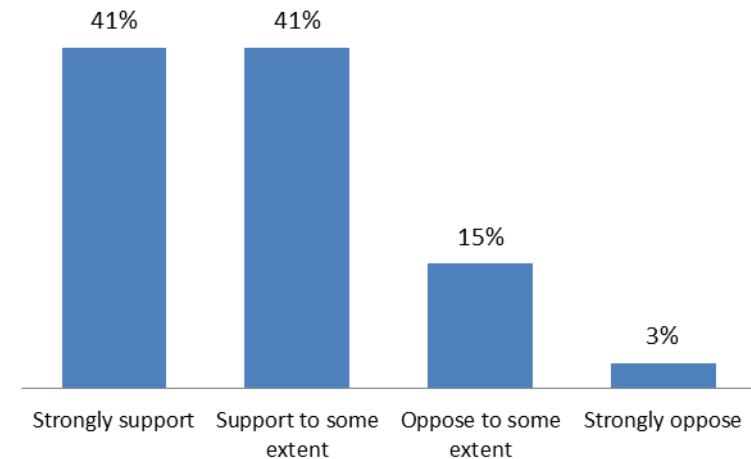

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, Majority Pakistanis (82%) support foreign investment in Pakistan.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people support investment made by other companies/ countries in Pakistan, while others oppose. Kindly tell to what extent do you support or oppose the investment made by foreign companies/ countries in Pakistan?” In response to this question, 41% strongly support foreign investment, 41% support to some extent, 15% oppose to some extent, while 3% strongly oppose.

Foreign direct investment (FDI) is important for developing countries as it helps achieve sustainable economic growth. Therefore, it is encouraging to see majority Pakistanis understanding the importance of FDI and supporting it.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1843 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 24– October 31, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

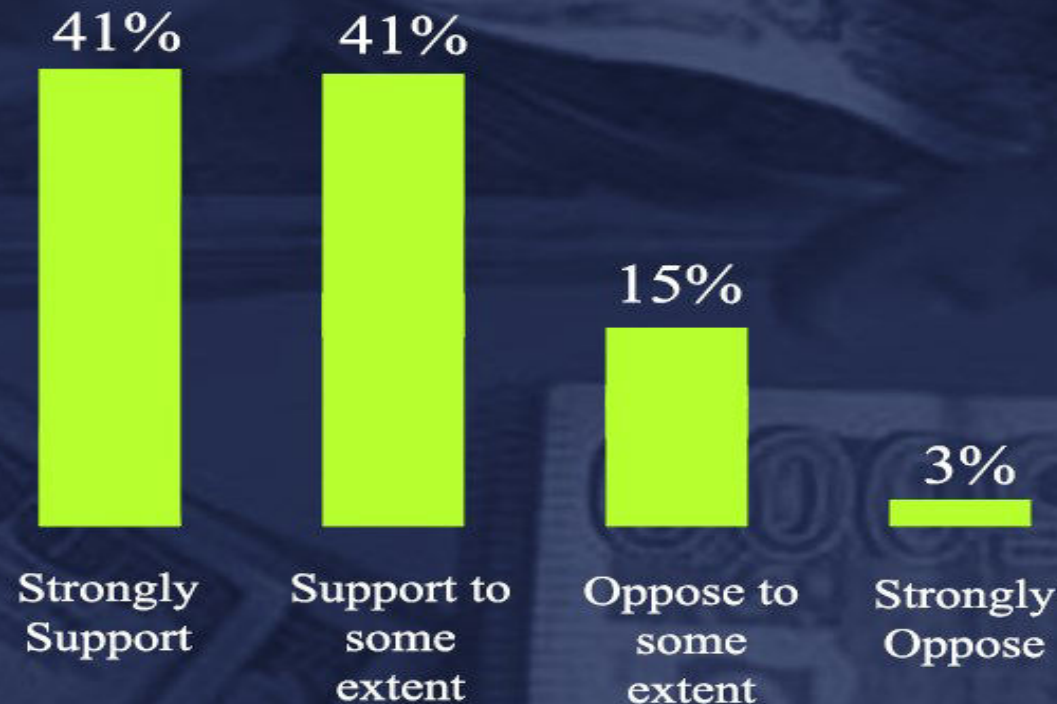

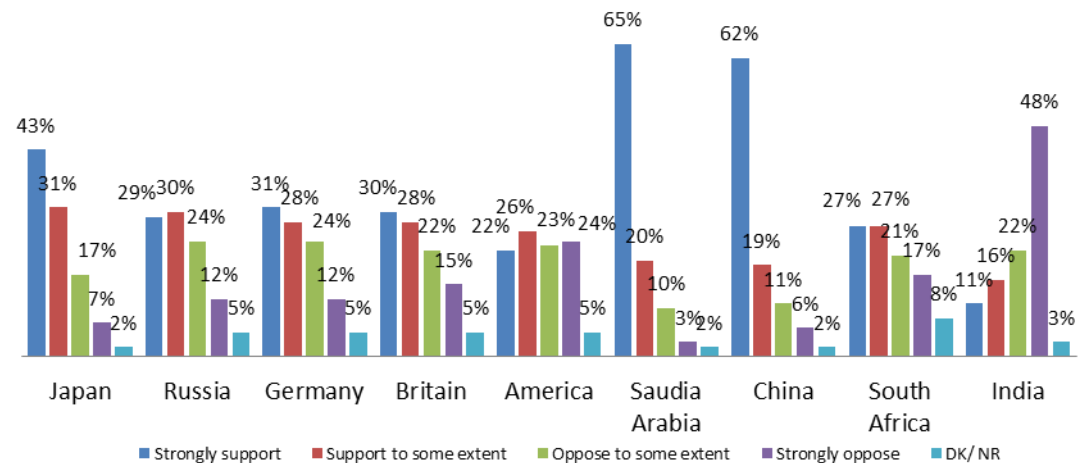

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Please think about the following countries and tell to what extent do you support or oppose the investment made by each in Pakistan?" In response to this question, for Japan, 43% said strongly support, 31% said support to some extent, 17% said oppose to some extent, 7% said strongly oppose and 2% did not know or did not wish to respond. For Russia, 29% said strongly support, 30% said support to some extent, 24% said oppose to some extent, 12% said strongly oppose and 5% did not know or did not wish to respond. For Germany, 31% said strongly support, 28% said support to some extent, 24% said oppose to some extent, 12% said strongly oppose and 5% did not know or did not wish to respond. For Britain, 30% said strongly support, 28% said support to some extent, 22% said oppose to some extent, 15% said strongly oppose and 5% did not know or did not wish to respond. For America, 22% said strongly support, 26% said support to some extent, 23% said oppose to some extent, 24% said strongly oppose and 5% did not know or did not wish to respond. For Saudia Arabia, 65% said strongly support, 20% said support to some extent, 10% said oppose to some extent, 3% said strongly oppose and 2% did not know or did not wish to respond. For China, 62% said strongly support, 19% said support to some extent, 11% said oppose to some extent, 6% said strongly oppose and 2% did not know or did not wish to respond. For South Africa, 27% said strongly support, 27% said support to some extent, 21% said oppose to some extent, 17% said strongly oppose and 8% did not know or did not wish to respond. For India, 11% said strongly support, 16% said support to some extent, 22% said oppose to some extent, 48% said strongly oppose and 3% did not know or did not wish to respond.

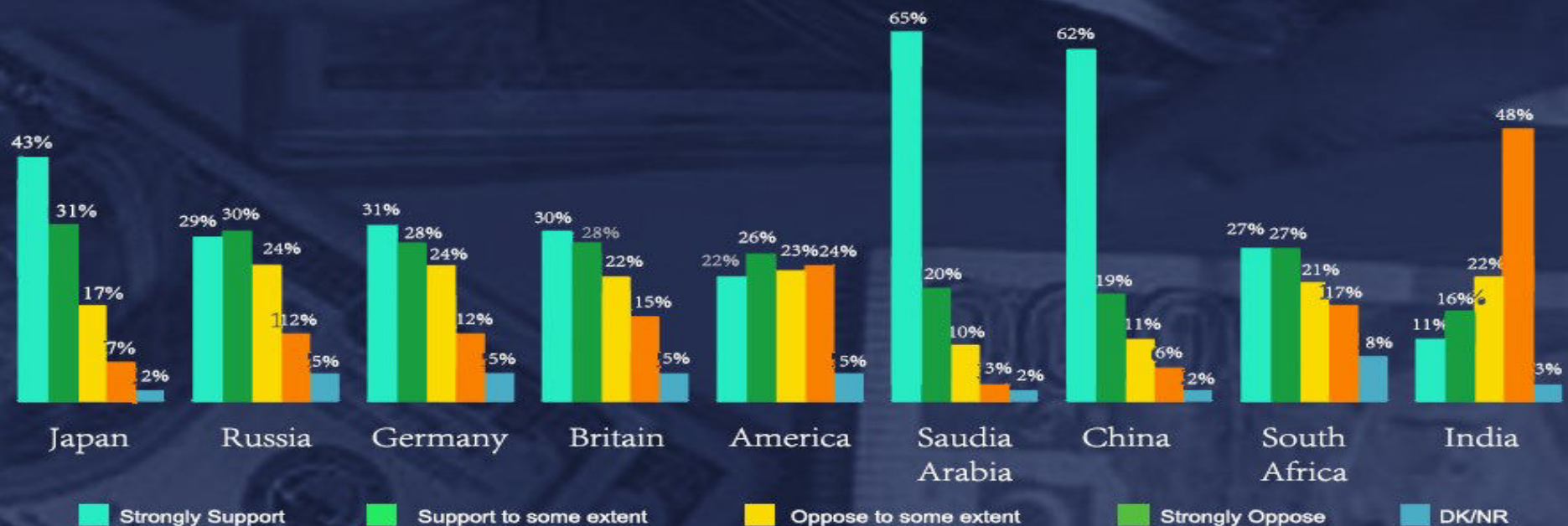

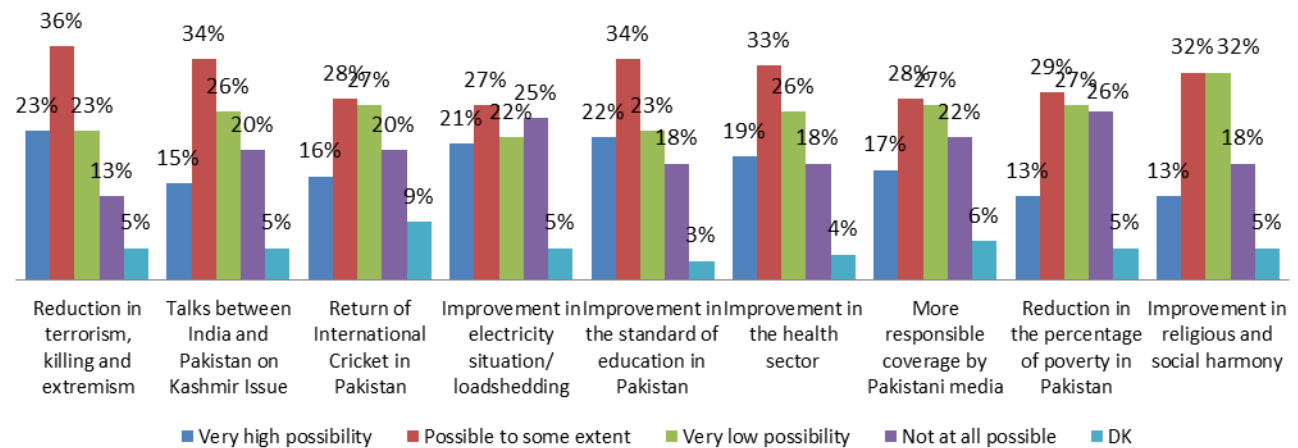

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority Pakistanis are optimistic that terrorism, killing and extremism will reduce in 2017 and education and health sector will improve.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Please think about the New Year 2017 and please tell to what extent are the following likely to occur?" In response to this question, 23% said there is a very high possibility of reduction in terrorism, killing and extremism in 2017, 36% said possible to some extent, 23% said very low possibility, 13% said not possible at all and 5% did not know. For talks between India and Pakistan on Kashmir issue in 2017, 15% said there is a very high possibility, 34% said possible to some extent, 26% said very low possibility, 20% said not at all possible and 5% did not know. For return of international cricket in Pakistan in 2017, 16% said there is a very high possibility, 28% said possible to some extent, 27% said very low possibility, 20% said not at all possible and 9% did not know. For improvement in electricity situation in 2017, 21% said there is a very high possibility, 27% said possible to some extent, 22% said very low possibility, 25% said not at all possible and 5% did not know. For improvement in standard of education in 2017, 22% said there is a very high possibility, 34% said possible to some extent, 23% said very low possibility, 18% said not at all possible and 3% did not know. For improvement in the health sector in 2017, 19% said there is a very high possibility, 33% said possible to some extent, 26% said very low possibility, 18% said not at all possible and 4% did not know. For more responsible media coverage in 2017, 17% said there is a very high possibility, 28% said possible to some extent, 27% said very low possibility, 22% said not at all possible and 6% did not know. For reduction in the percentage of poverty in Pakistan in 2017, 13% said there is a very high possibility, 29% said possible to some extent, 27% said very low possibility, 26% said not at all possible and 5% did not know. For improvement in religious and social harmony in 2017, 13% said there is a very high possibility, 32% said possible to some extent, 32% said very low possibility, 18% said not at all possible and 5% did not know.

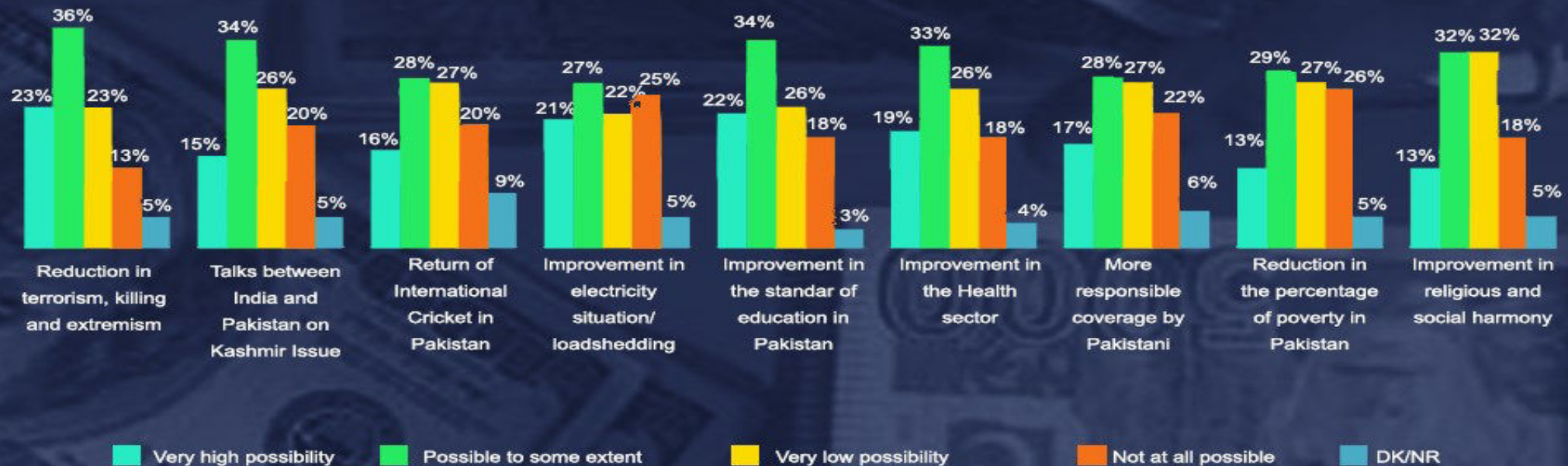

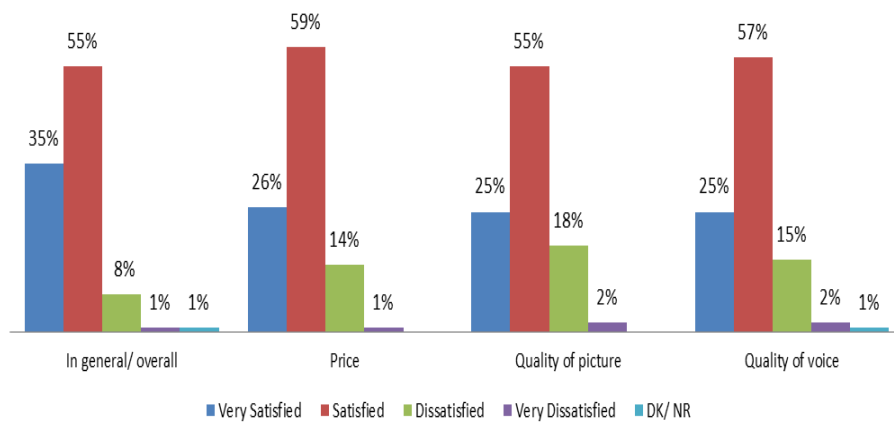

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 9 in 10 Pakistanis are satisfied with the overall service of their cable operator; 15% are dissatisfied with the price, 20% with quality of picture and 17% with quality of voice.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Please tell to what extent is your household satisfied or dissatisfied with your cable operator in the following areas?" In response to this question, for overall service of cable operator, 35% said they are very satisfied, 55% said satisfied, 8% said dissatisfied, 1% said very dissatisfied and 1% did not know or did not wish to respond. For price, 26% said they are very satisfied, 59% said satisfied, 14% said dissatisfied and 1% said very dissatisfied. For quality of picture, 25% said they are very satisfied, 55% said satisfied, 18% said dissatisfied and 2% said very dissatisfied. For quality of voice, 25% said they are very satisfied, 57% said satisfied, 15% said dissatisfied 2% said very dissatisfied and 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.
