Domestic Violence in Pakistan: 65% Pakistanis believe domestic violence is a family's personal problem; 5% more females than males say that social organizations/ media should play a role. (GRF POLL)

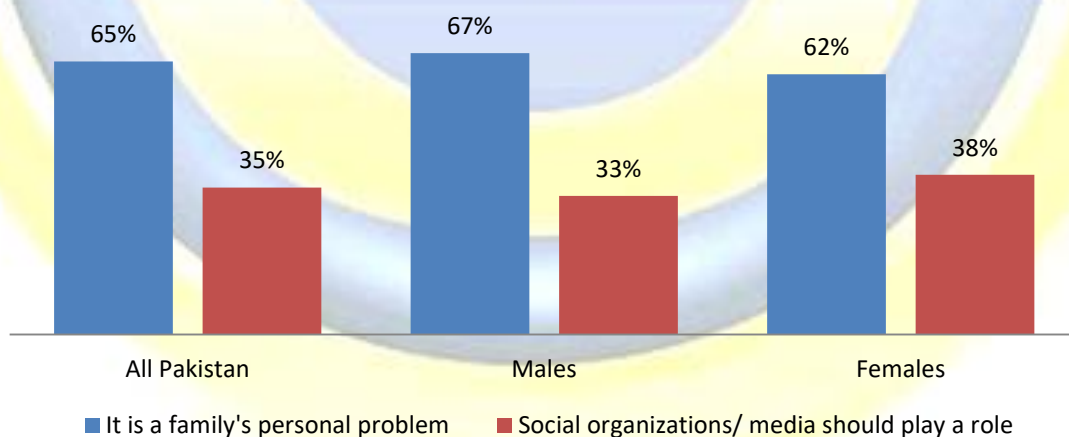
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 65% Pakistanis believe domestic violence is a family's personal problem; 5% more females than males say that social organizations/ media should play a role.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, "In your view is domestic violence a family's personal problem or should media and social organizations be involved in it?" In response to this question, 65% said domestic violence is a family's personal problem, whereas 35% said social organizations/ media should play a role.

Gender Breakdown:

67% of the male respondents said that domestic violence is a family's personal problem, 33% said social organizations/ media should play a role. On the other hand, 62% of the female respondents said that domestic violence is a family's personal problem, 38% said social organizations/ media should play a role.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1871 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 26 – January 2, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
