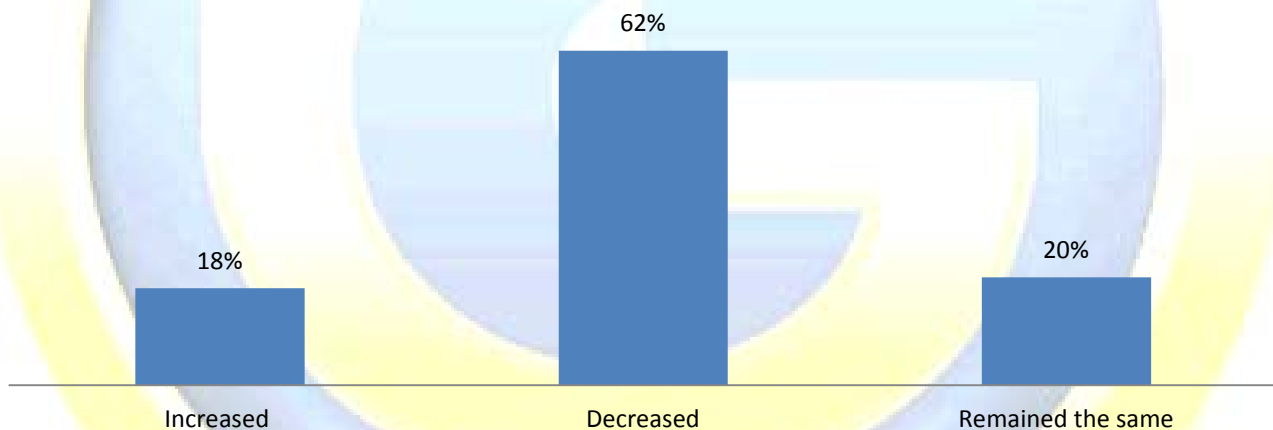

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 62% Pakistanis say that electricity load shedding has decreased in their area this year compared to the previous year.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, compared to the previous year has electricity load shedding in your area increased, decreased or remained the same this year?” In response to this question, 18% said electricity load shedding has increased in their areas this year compared to the previous year, 62% said decreased and 20% said remained the same.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1878 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 30 – February 6, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
