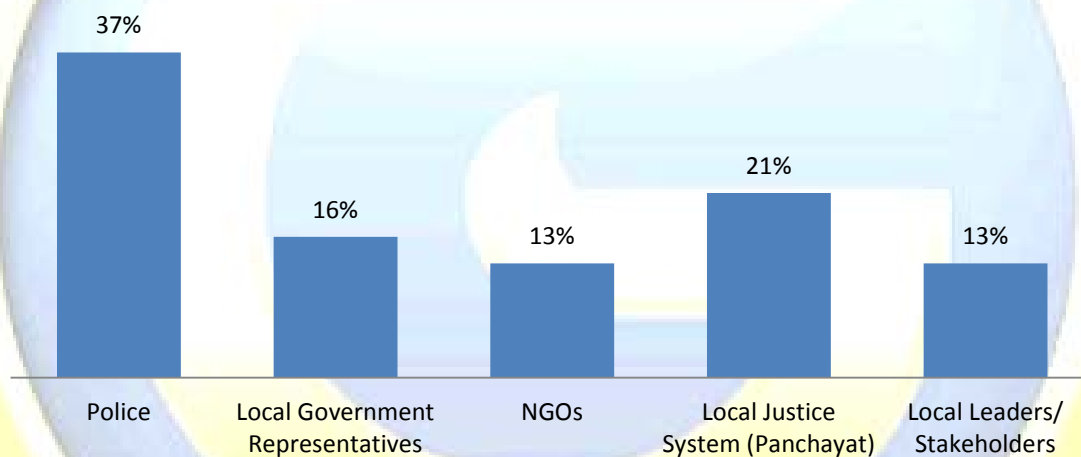
**37 % Pakistanis say they will go to the police if subjected to violence;
21 % cite local justice system. (GRF POLL)**

Islamabad, March 3, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 37% Pakistanis say they will go to the police if subjected to violence; 21% cite local justice system.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “If God forbid, you experience any kind of violence, which institution will you go to?” In response to this question, 37% said they will go to the police, 16% said local government representatives, 13% said NGOs, 21% said local justice system (panchayat), while 13% said local leaders/ stakeholders.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1871 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 26 – January 2, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
