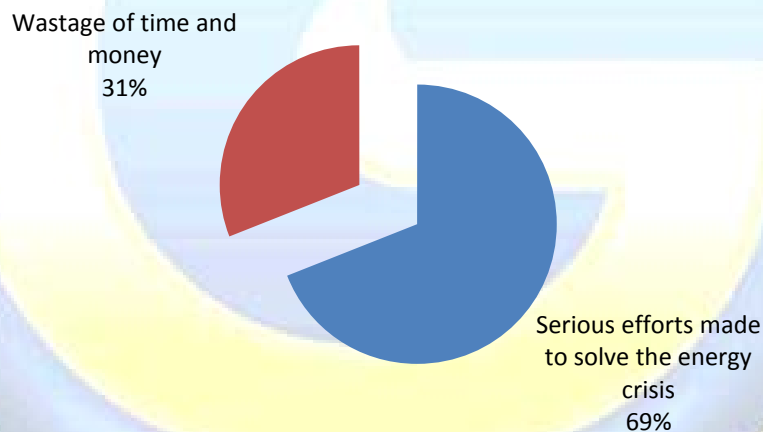

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 69% Pakistanis say that the government is making serious efforts to solve the energy crisis in the country.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people believe that the current federal government is genuinely trying to solve the energy crisis, while others say this is all corruption and wastage of time and the government is not doing anything serious to solve the energy crisis. What is your opinion? In response to this question, 69% said that the government is making serious efforts to solve the energy crisis, while 31% said that the efforts of the government are wastage of time and money.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1878 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 30 – February 6, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
