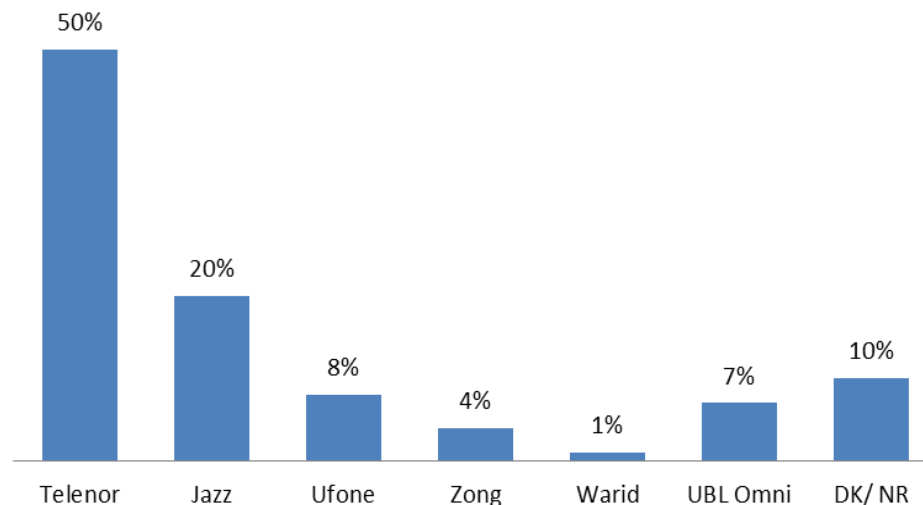

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, Telenor is the most cited mobile money company in Pakistan followed by Mobilink Jazz.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who said they knew what mobile money was, were asked, “When I say mobile money, which company’s name comes to your mind first?” In response to this question, 50% said Telenor, 20% said Jazz, 8% said Ufone, 4% said Zong, 1% said Warid, 7% said UBL Omni and 10% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 916 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 5– December 12, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

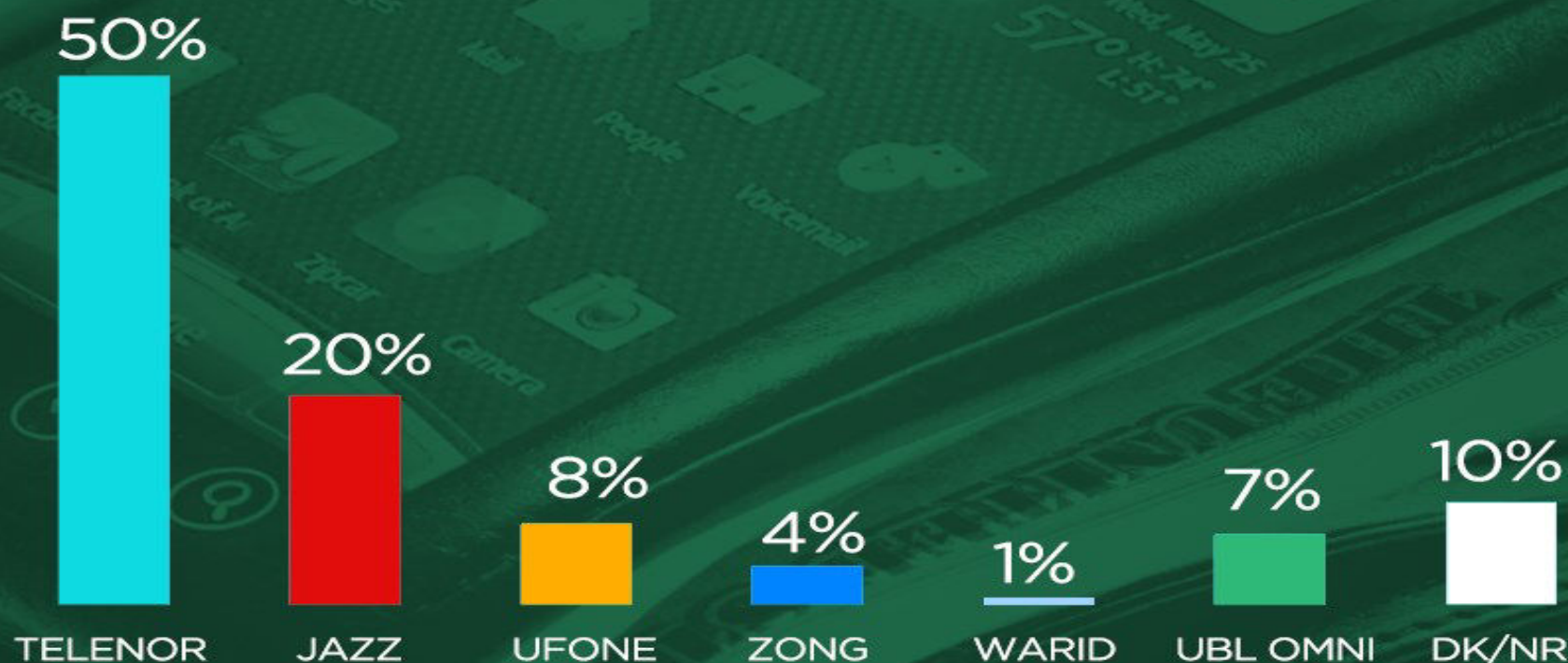

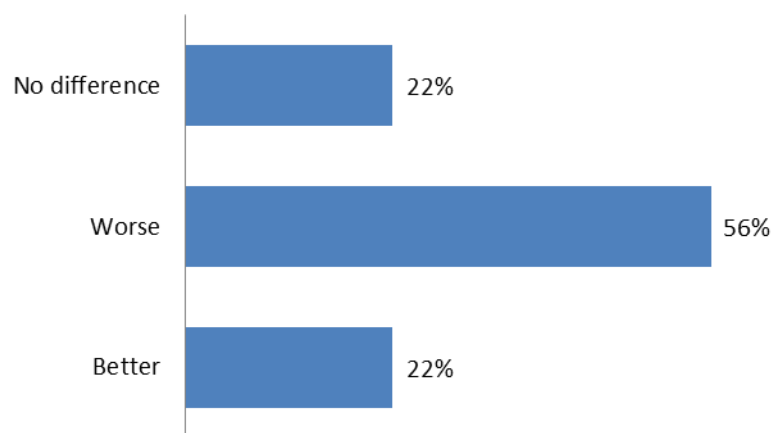
When I say mobile money, which company's name comes to your mind first?

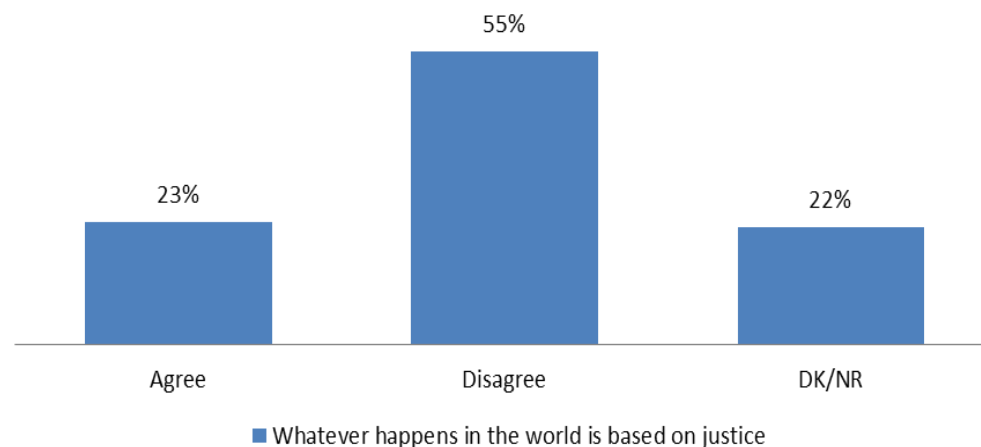

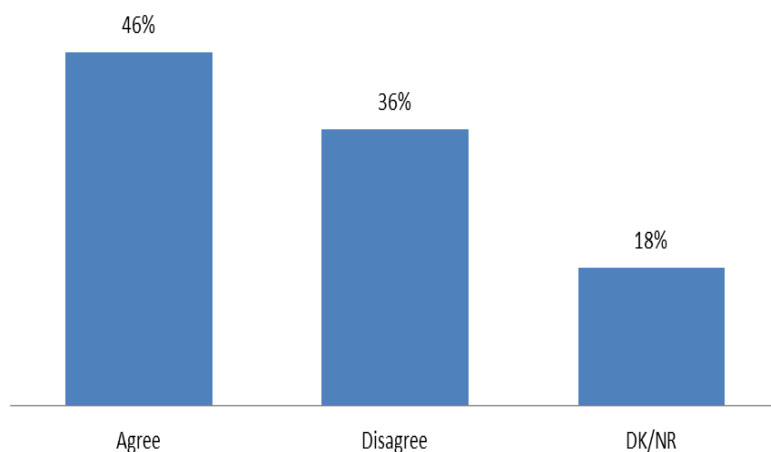

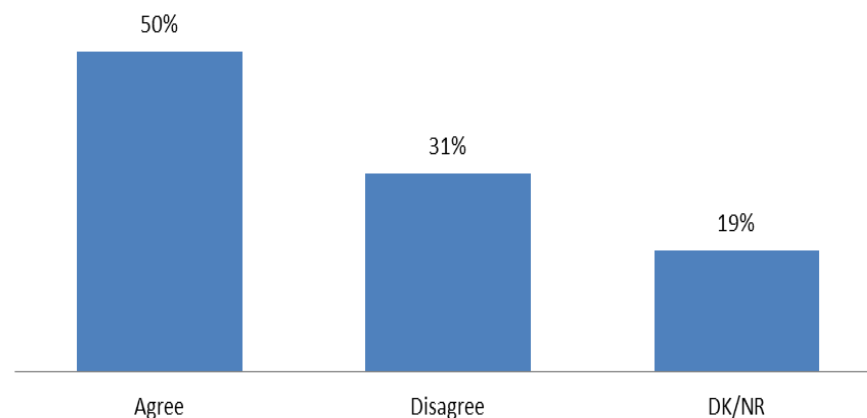
