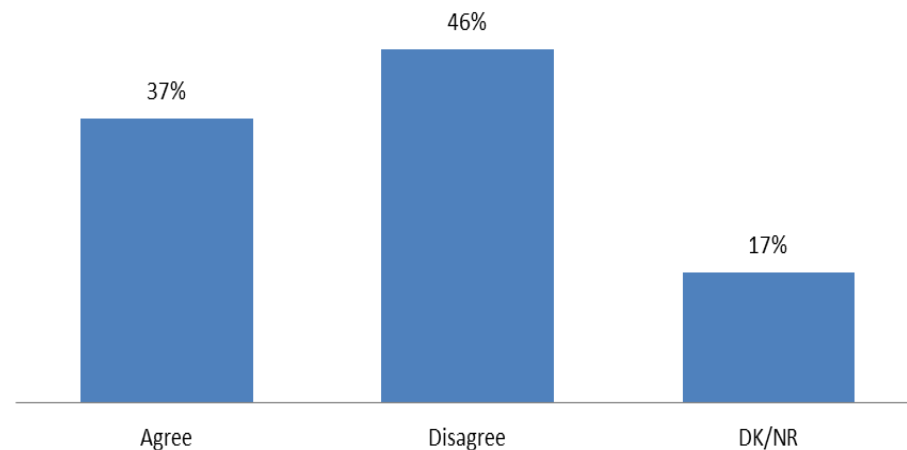

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “I will read a few statements. Please tell if you agree or disagree with the following? [Only capable people get admission into educational institutions]” In response to this question, 37% agreed that only capable people get admission into educational institutions, 46% disagreed while 17% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1871 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 26 – January 2, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.



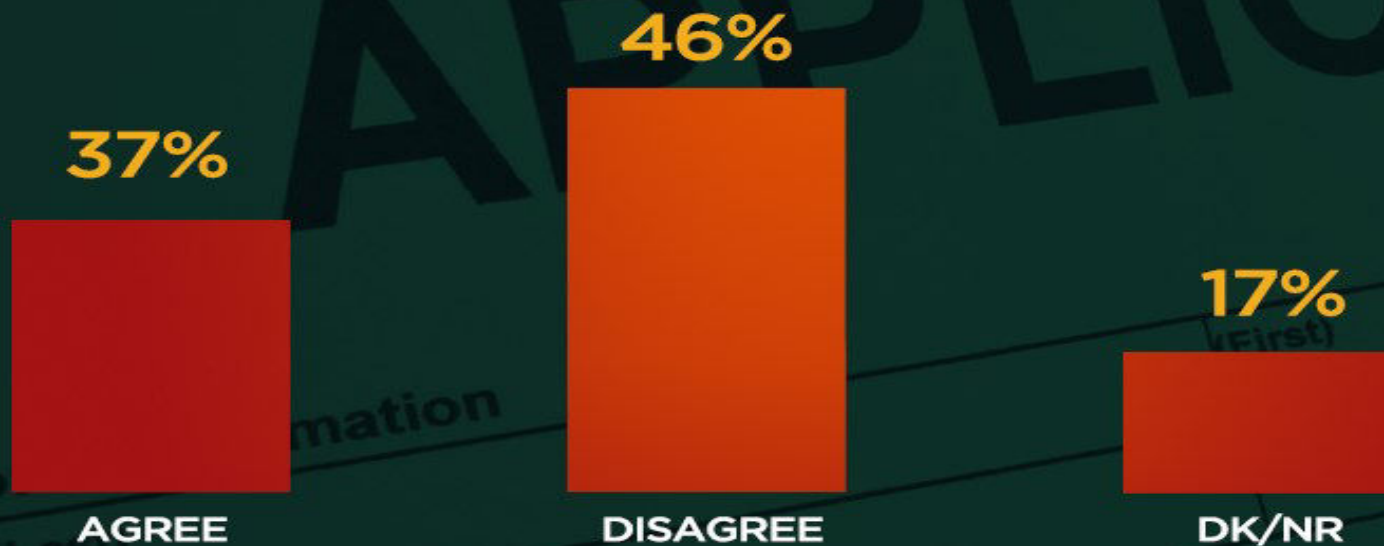

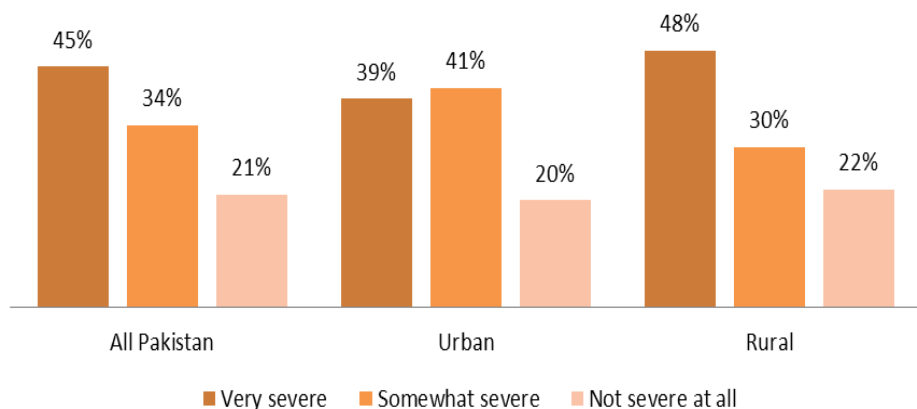

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 79% Pakistanis cite gas load shedding to be a severe problem (very or somewhat) in their area; 9% more rural than urban residents say gas load shedding is a very severe problem in their area.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “How severe is the problem of gas load shedding in your area?” In response to this question, 45% said the problem of gas load shedding is very severe, 34% said somewhat severe and 21% said not severe at all.

Rural Urban Breakdown:

In urban areas, 39% said the problem of gas load shedding is very severe, 41% said somewhat severe and 20% said not severe at all. On the contrary in rural areas, 48% said the problem of gas load shedding is very severe, 30% said somewhat severe and 22% said not severe at all.

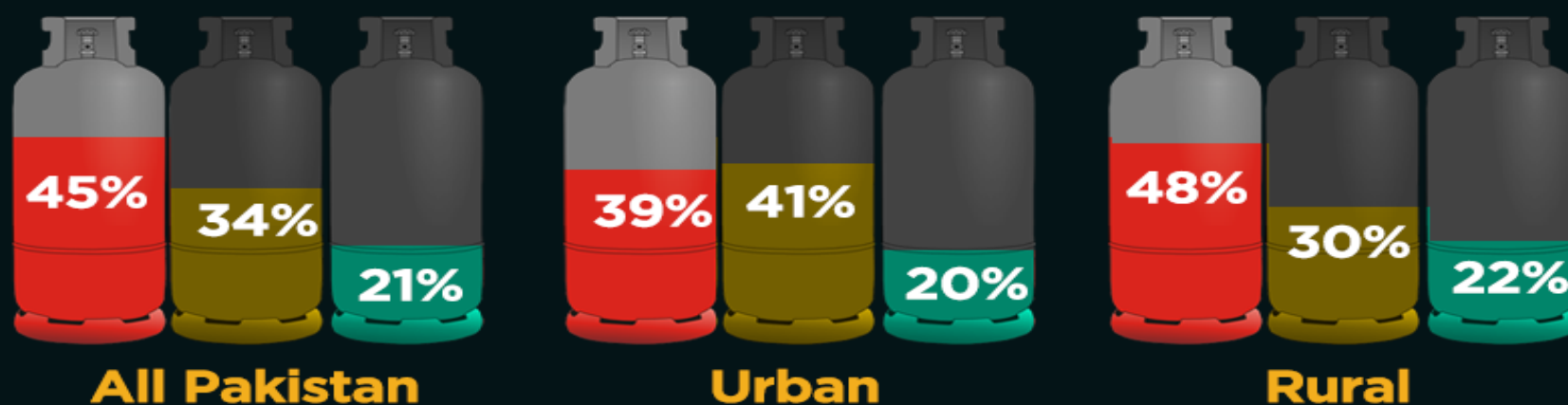
Comparing the two regions, 9% more rural than urban residents cite gas load shedding to be a very severe problem in their area.

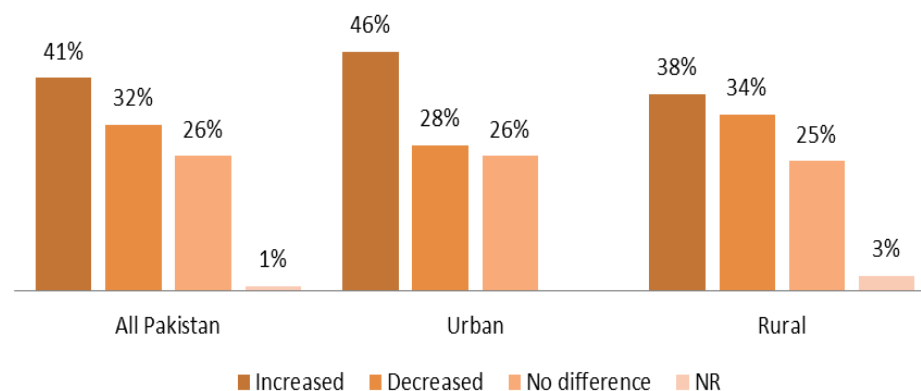
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Please think about gas load shedding/ supply during winters the previous year and please tell compared to the previous year, has the supply/ pressure of gas in your area increased, decreased or there is no difference this year?" In response to this question, 41% said the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area this year compared to the previous year, 32% said decreased, 26% said there was no difference and 1% did not respond.

Rural Urban Breakdown:

In urban areas, 46% said the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area this year compared to the previous year, 28% said decreased and 26% said there was no difference. On the contrary in rural areas, 38% said the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area this year compared to the previous year, 34% said decreased, 25% said there was no difference and 3% did not respond.

Comparing the two regions, 8% more urban than rural residents said that the supply/ pressure of gas increased in their area compared to the previous year.

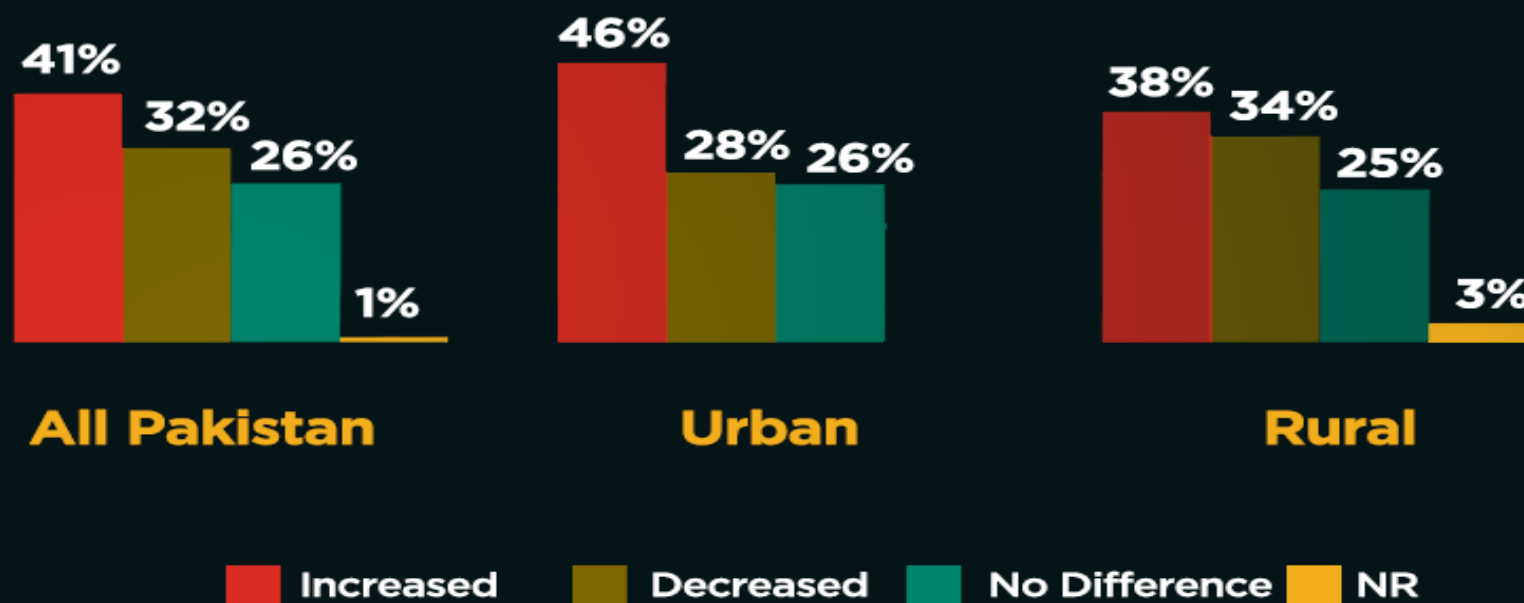

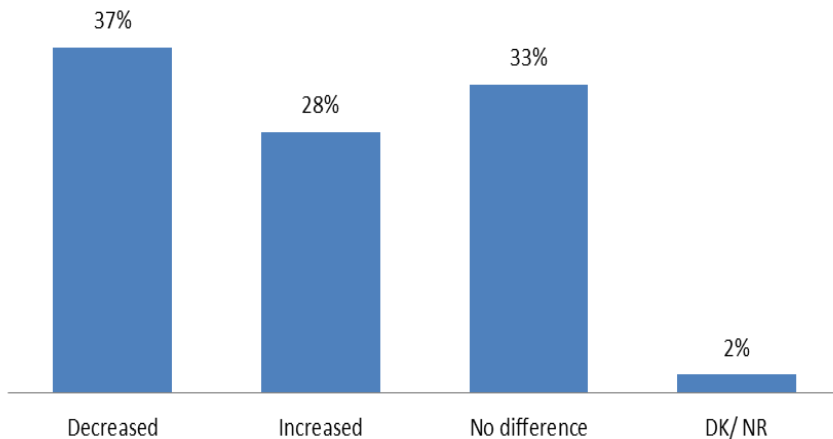

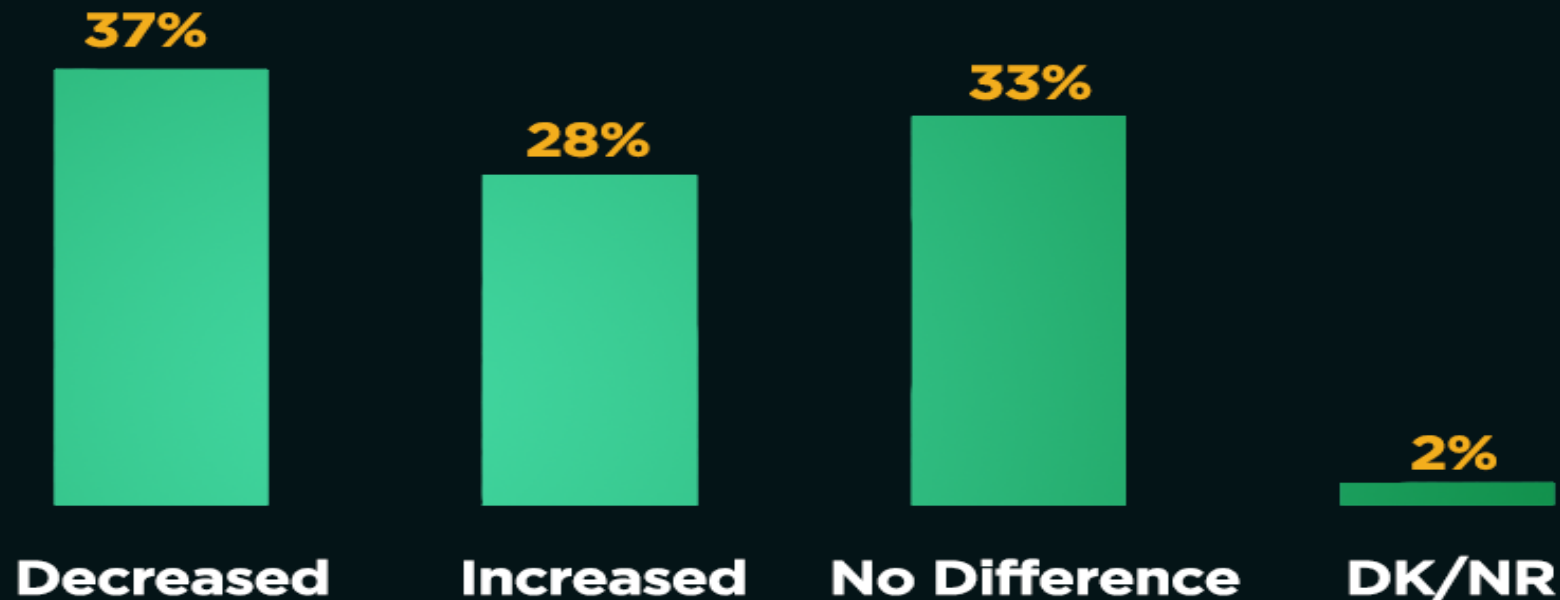

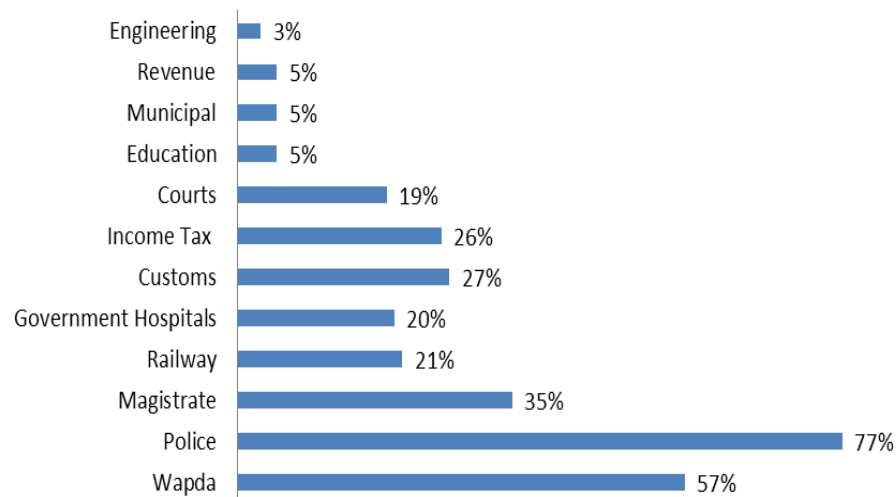

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "In your opinion which departments receive most bribe?" In response to this question, 57% said Wapda receives the most bribery, 77% said police, 35% said magistrate, 21% said railway, 20% said government hospital, 27% said customs department, 26% said income tax department, 19% said courts, 5% each said education, municipal and revenue department while 3% said engineering department.

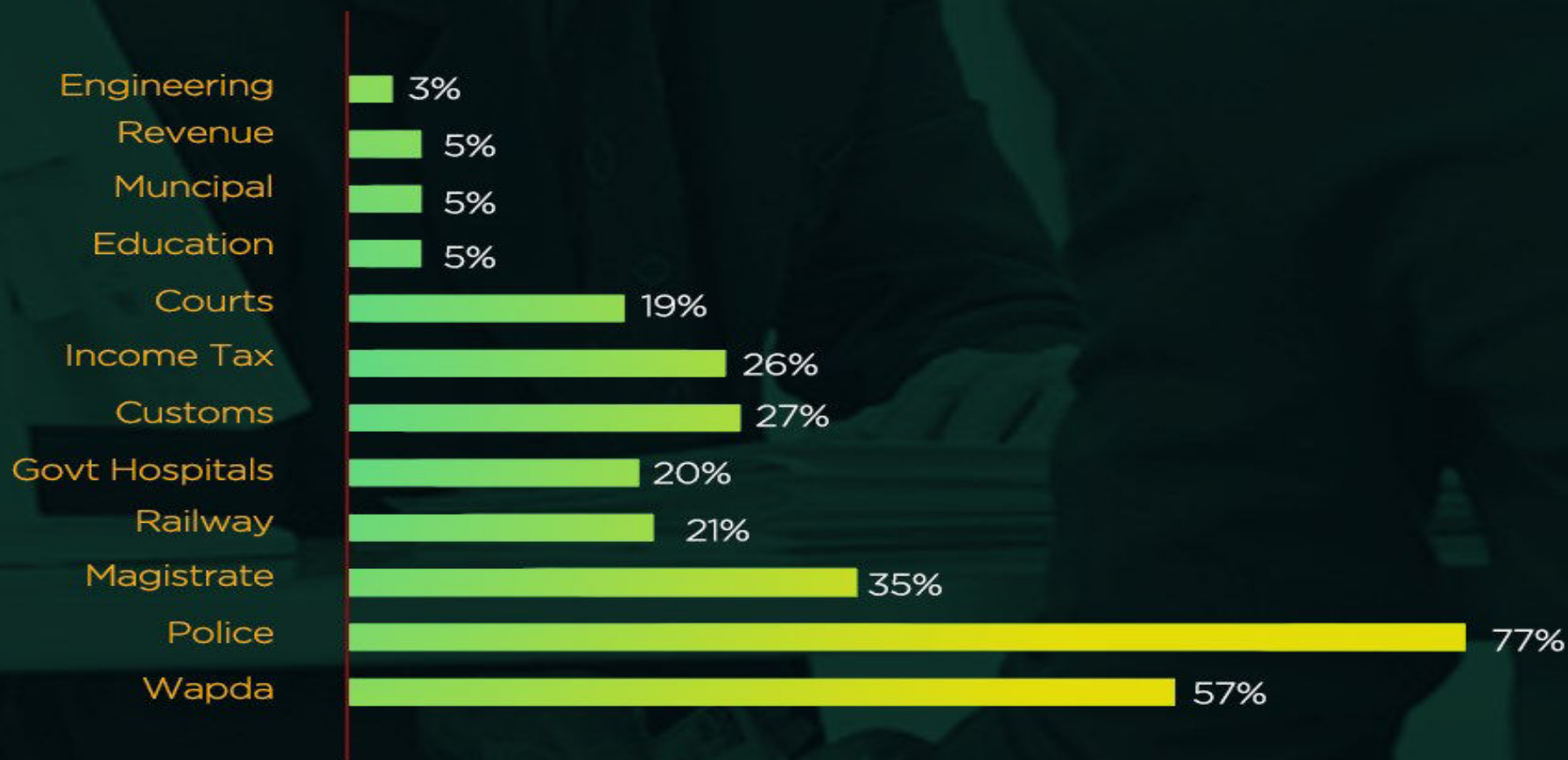
