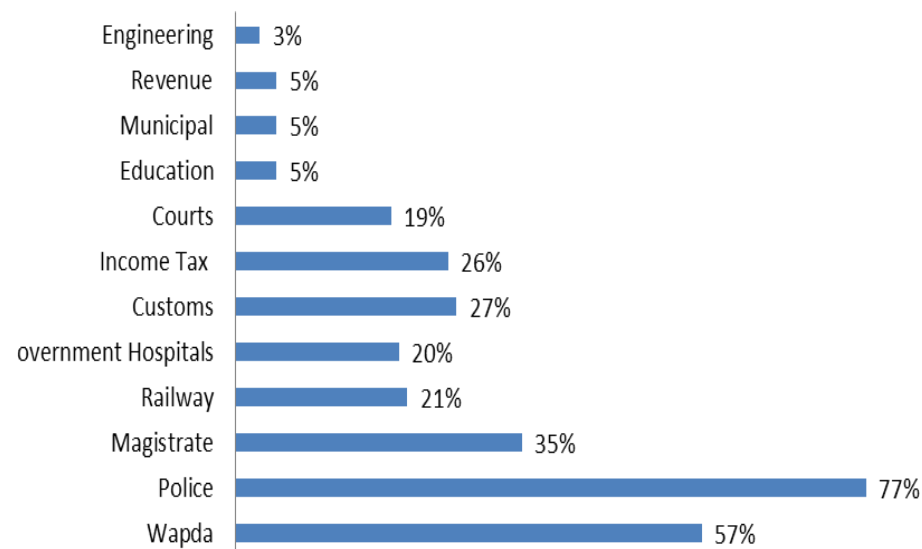

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 77% Pakistanis believe police department receives the most bribery, followed by 57% who cite Wapda.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion which departments receive most bribe?” In response to this question, 57% said Wapda receives the most bribery, 77% said police, 35% said magistrate, 21% said railway, 20% said government hospital, 27% said customs department, 26% said income tax department, 19% said courts, 5% each said education, municipal and revenue department while 3% said engineering department.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1728 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 9 – January 16, 2017. 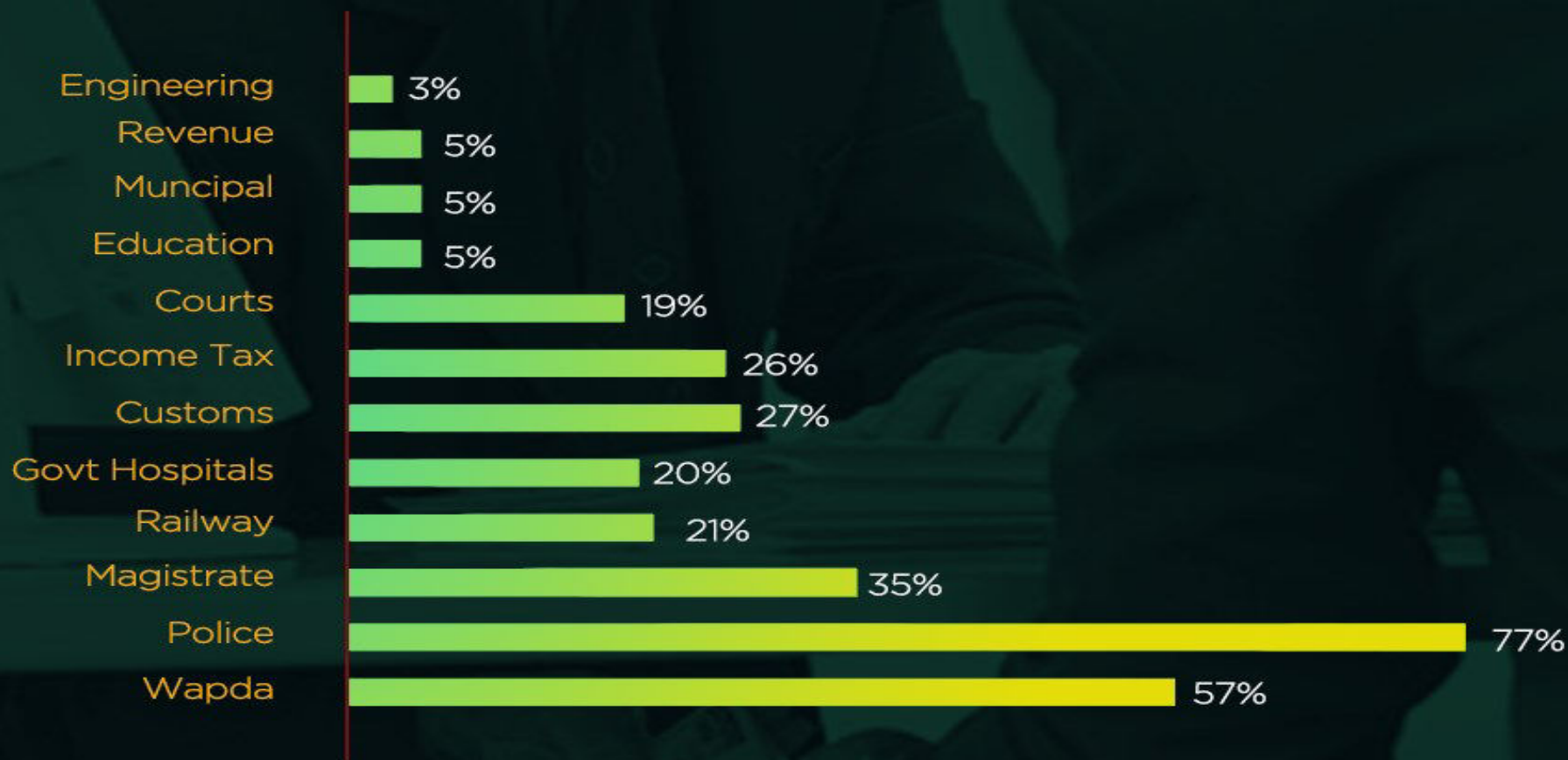

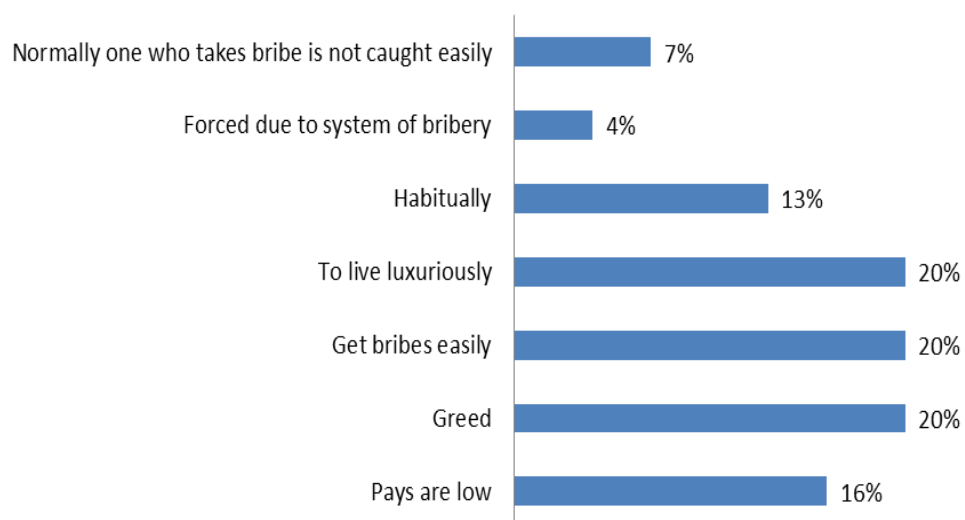
In your opinion which departments receive most bribe?

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 40% Pakistanis say that government officials take bribe out of greed or to live luxuriously; 16% cite low pays.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Why do government officials take bribe?” In response to this question, 16% said government officials take bribe because their pays are low, 20% each said greed, get bribes easily and to live luxuriously, 13% said habitually, 4% said are forced due to system of bribery and 7% said normally one who takes bribe is not caught easily.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1728 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 9 – January 16, 2017. 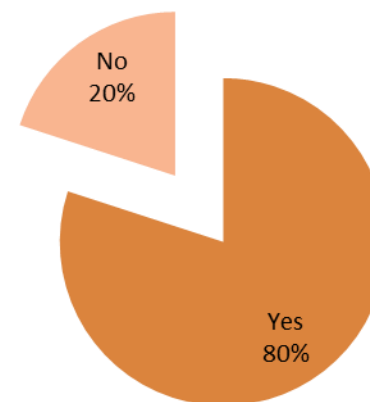

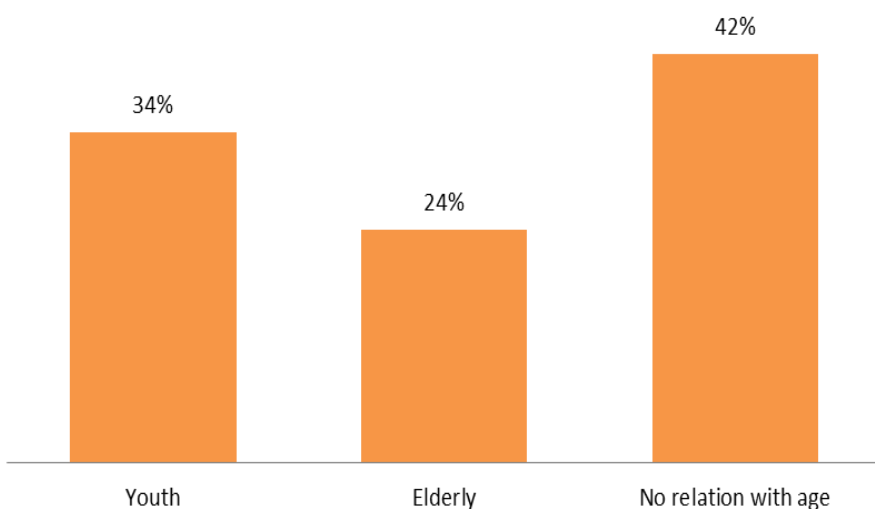

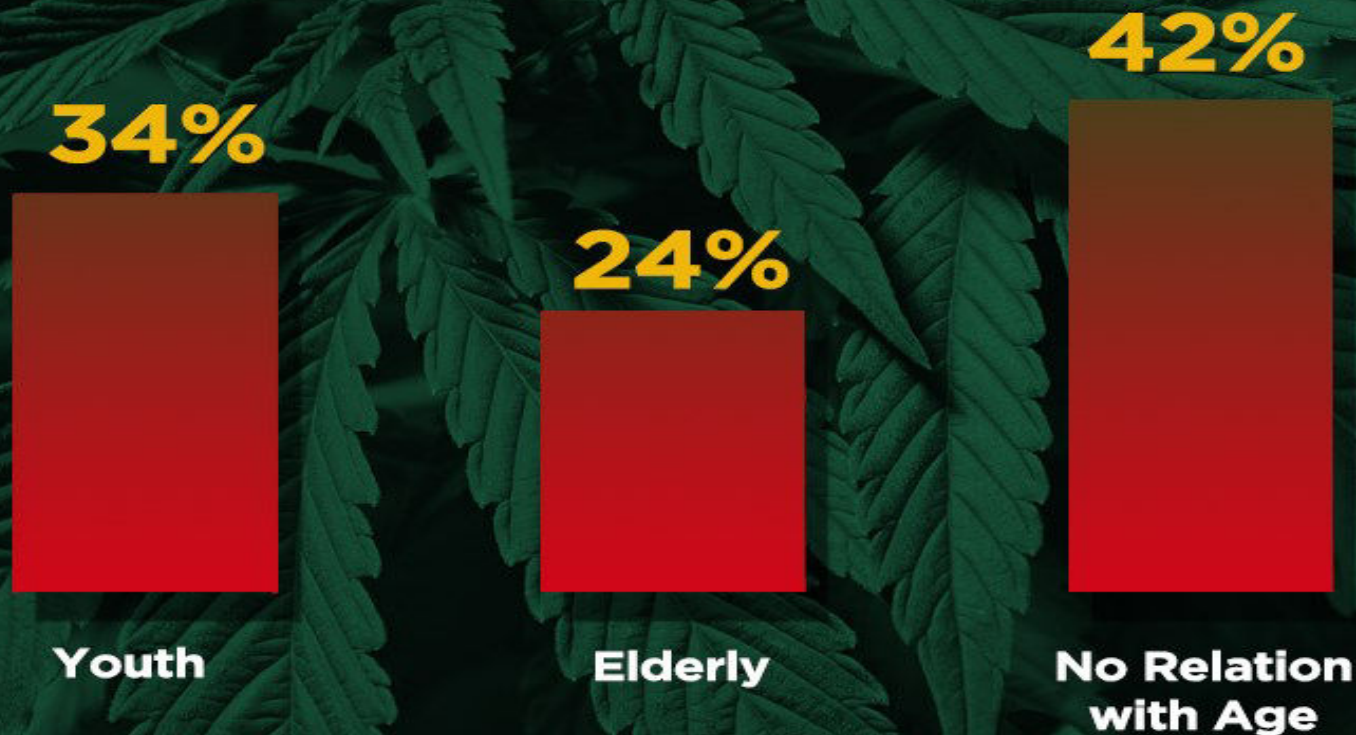

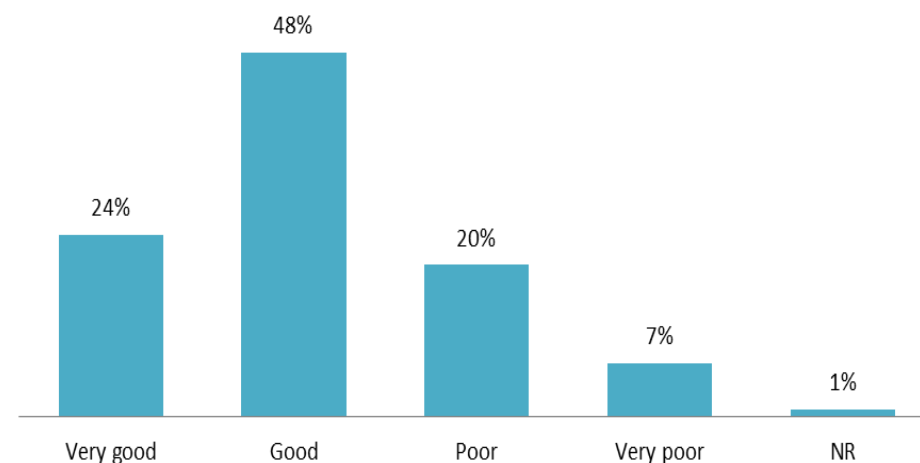

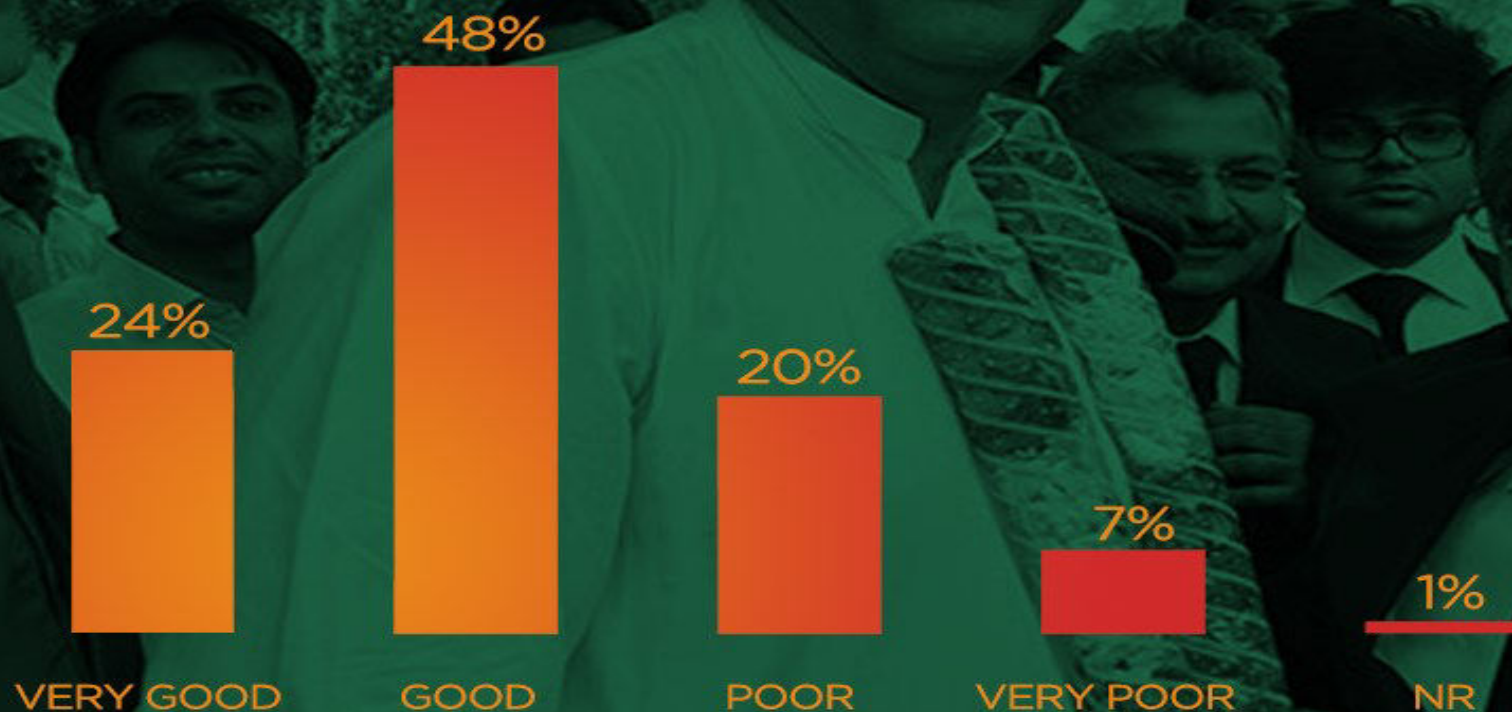
