



## Opinion Poll Legal System/Judiciary/ Supreme Court Panama Leaks

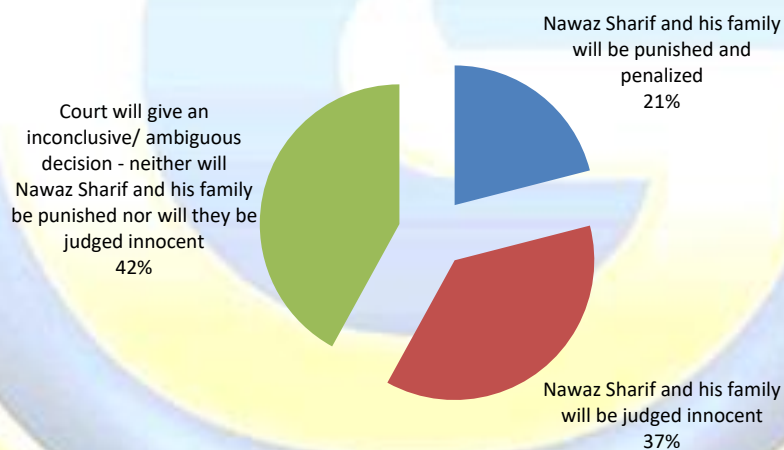
**Public Perception on Panama Leaks Case: 4 in 10 Pakistanis believe that Supreme Court will give an inconclusive/ ambiguous decision on the Panama Leaks case; 65% opine that the court's decision will be accepted by the majority. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

Islamabad, March 31, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 4 in 10 Pakistanis believe that Supreme Court will give an inconclusive/ ambiguous decision on the Panama Leaks case; 65% opine that the court's decision will be accepted by the majority.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Keeping in mind the Panama Leaks case, please tell in your opinion, which of the following result is most likely?" In response to this question, 21% said that Nawaz Sharif and his family will be punished and penalized, 37% said that Nawaz Sharif and his family will be judged innocent, while 42% said that court will give an inconclusive/ ambiguous decision.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1813 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 27 – March 6, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately  $\pm 2-3$  per cent at 95% confidence level.
