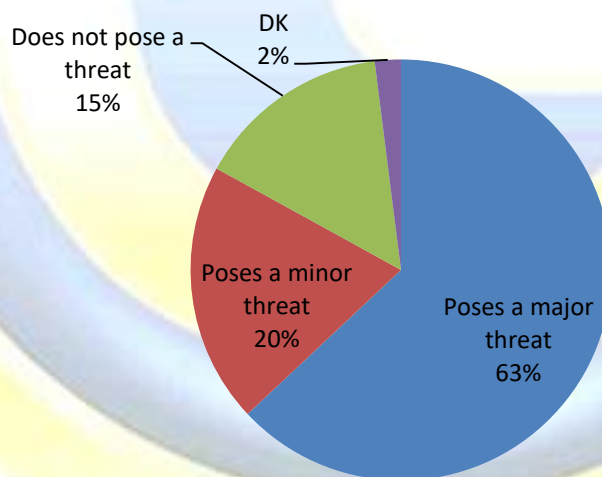
A significant majority of Pakistanis (83%) believe that India poses a threat to Pakistan's security over the next 10 years. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, May 15, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a significant majority of Pakistanis (83%) believe that India poses a threat to Pakistan's security in the next 10 years.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "For each of the following countries please say whether you personally think it poses a threat or does not pose a threat to the security of Pakistan in the next ten years. And is that a major threat or a minor threat [India]?" In response to this question, 63% said that India poses a major threat to Pakistan's security in the next 10 years, 20% said poses a minor threat, while 15% said it does not pose a threat. 2% did not know.

Question: "For each of the following countries please say whether you personally think it poses a threat or does not pose a threat to the security of Pakistan in the next ten years. And is that a major threat or a minor threat [India]?"

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1816 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 10 – April 17, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
