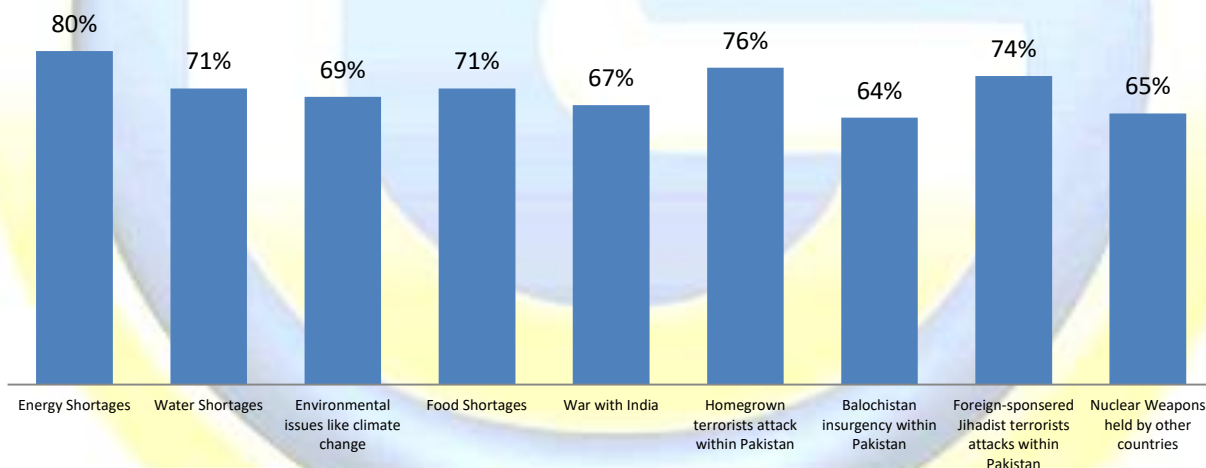
4 in 5 Pakistanis say that energy shortage is a threat to Pakistan's security over the next ten years, followed by 76% who say homegrown terrorist attacks. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, April 17, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 4 in 5 Pakistanis say that energy shortage is a threat to Pakistan's security over the next ten years, followed by 76% who say homegrown terrorist attacks.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Now think about possible threats to Pakistan's security over the next ten years, please say whether you regard each of the following as a threat to Pakistan?" In response to this question, 80% said energy shortage is a threat to Pakistan's security over the next ten years, 71% said water shortage, 69% said environmental issues like climatic change, 71% said food shortage, 67% said war with India, 76% said homegrown terrorist attacks within Pakistan, 64% said Balochistan insurgency within Pakistan, 74% said foreign-sponsored Jihadist terrorist attacks within Pakistan and 65% said nuclear weapons held by other countries.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1838 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 20 – February 27, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
