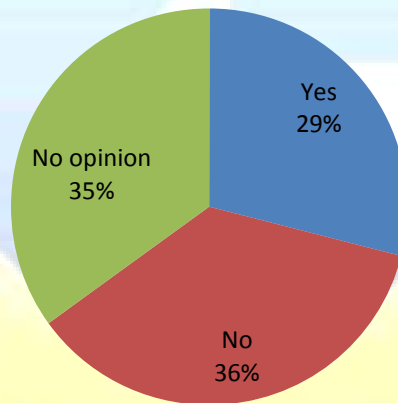

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 36% Pakistanis opine that the government lacks the right/ legitimacy to collect zakat and ushr, 1/3rd have no personal opinion in this regard.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Do you think that the government has the right to collect zakat and ushr?” In response to this question, 29% said the government has the right to collect zakat and ushr, 36% said no, while 35% said they have no opinion.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1833 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 06 – March 13, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
