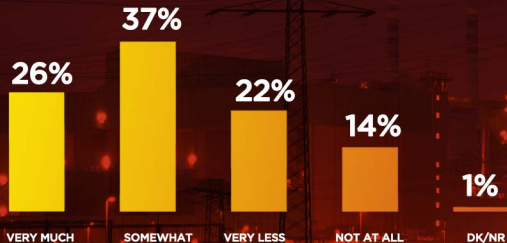

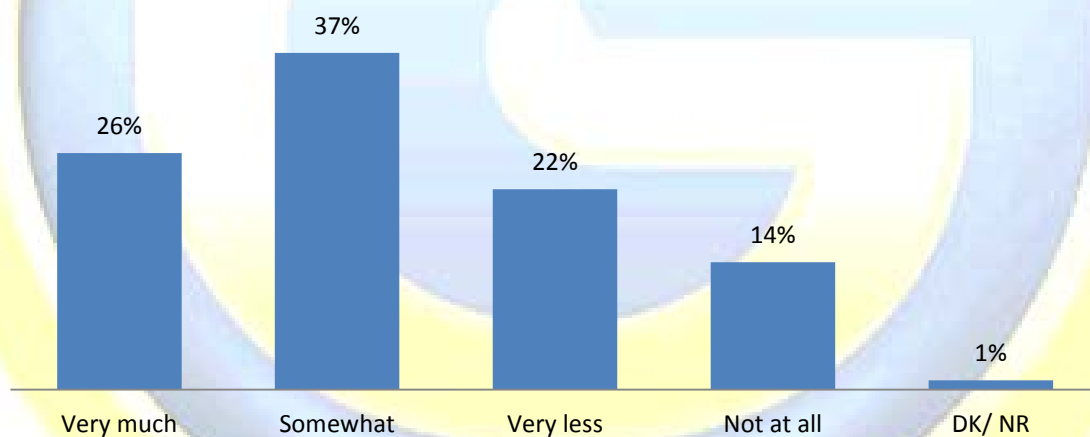

Islamabad, April 27, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 6 in 10 Pakistanis (63%) are bothered to see people wasting electricity by leaving lights and electronic devices on unnecessarily.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces, “How much, if at all, does it bother you to see people leaving lights and electronic devices on when no one is using them?” In response to this question, 26% said that it bothers them very much to see people leaving lights and electronic devices on when no one is using them, 37% said somewhat, 22% said very less, 14% said not at all and 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1813 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 27 – March 06, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm$ 2-3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
