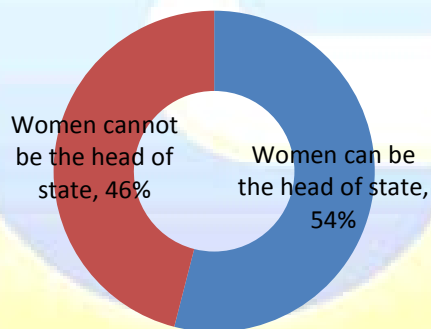
54 % Pakistanis opine that a capable and popular women can be head of state. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 54% of Pakistanis opine that a capable and popular women can be head of state.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people think that according to Islamic perspective a woman cannot be the head of state, whereas others think that if a women is capable and popular then there is nothing wrong in her being the head of the state. What is your opinion?” In response to this question, 54% said women can be the head of state, whereas 46% said that women cannot be the head of state.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 03 – April 10, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
