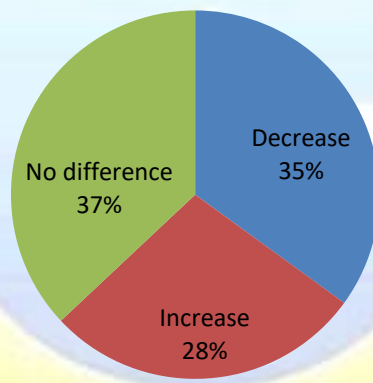
35% Pakistanis say that respect towards elders in our society has decreased. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, May 3, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 35% Pakistanis say that respect towards elders in our society has decreased.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Overall, in your opinion, has the trend of respect towards elders increased, decreased or remained the same in our society?” In response to this question, 35% said trend of respect towards elders has decreased, 28% said increased, while 37% said there is no difference.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 03 – April 10, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
