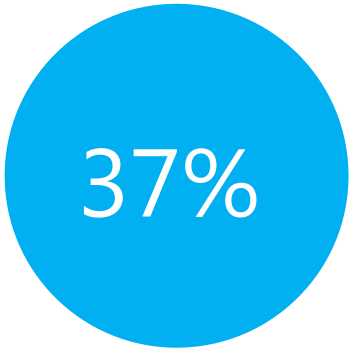

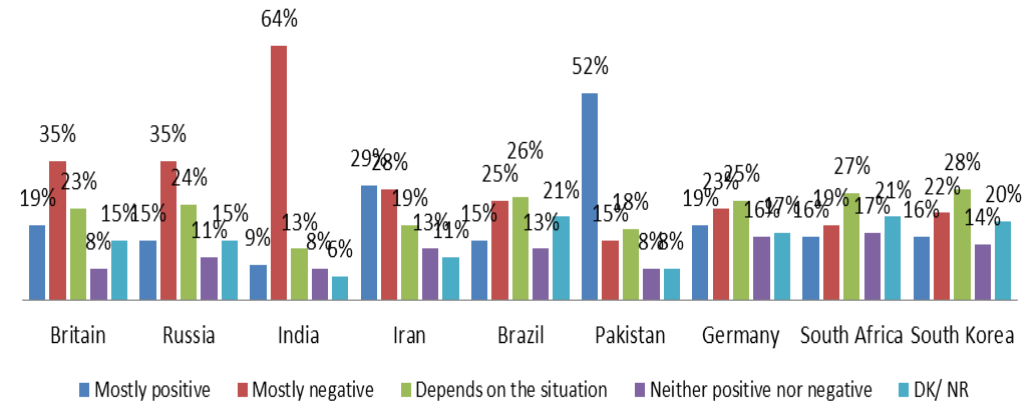

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 2 Pakistanis believe Pakistan has a positive impact on the world, 64% say India has a negative impact.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “For the following countries please tell do they mostly have a positive or negative impact on the world?” In response to this question, for Britain, 19% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 35% said mostly negative, 23% said depends on situation, 8% said neither positive nor negative and 15% did not respond. For Russia, 15% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 35% said mostly negative, 24% said depends on situation, 11% said neither positive nor negative and 15% did not respond. For India, 9% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 64% said mostly negative, 13% said depends on situation, 8% said neither positive nor negative and 6% did not respond. For Iran, 29% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 28% said mostly negative, 13% said depends on situation, 11% said neither positive nor negative and 15% did not respond. For Brazil, 25% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 26% said mostly negative, 13% said depends on situation, 21% said neither positive nor negative and 15% did not respond. For Pakistan, 52% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 15% said mostly negative, 18% said depends on situation, 8% said neither positive nor negative and 8% did not respond. For Germany, 19% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 23% said mostly negative, 25% said depends on situation, 16% said neither positive nor negative and 17% did not respond. For South Africa, 16% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 19% said mostly negative, 27% said depends on situation, 17% said neither positive nor negative and 21% did not respond. For South Korea, 16% said it has a mostly positive impact on the world, 22% said mostly negative, 28% said depends on situation, 14% said neither positive nor negative and 20% did not respond.

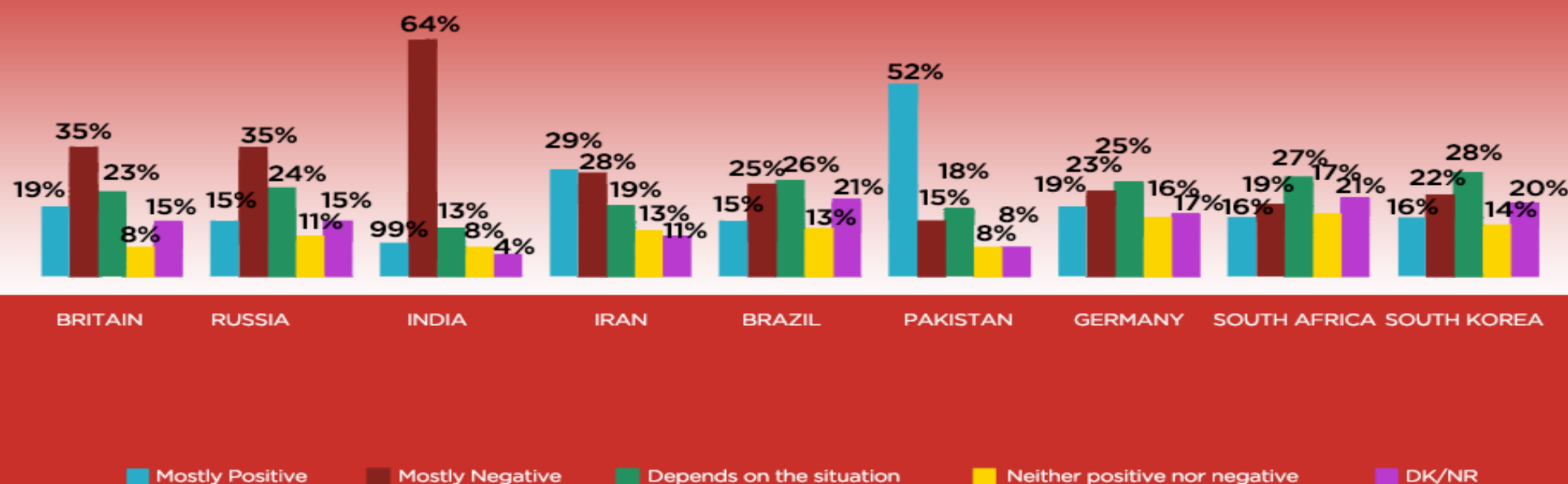

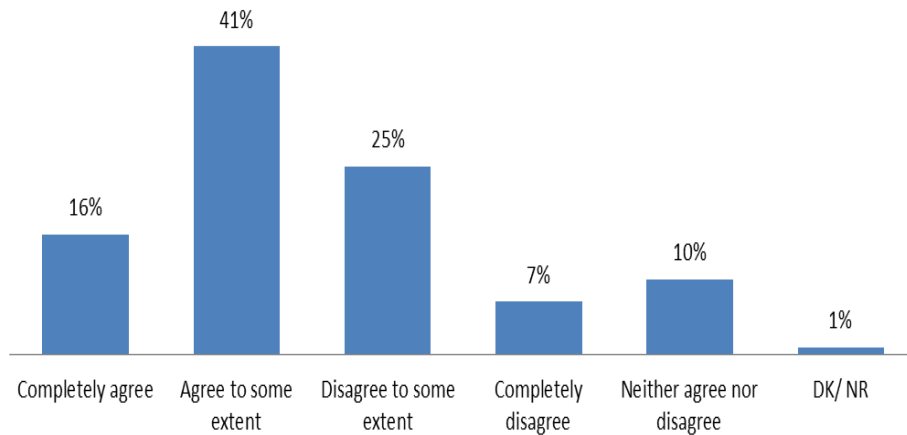
For the following countries please tell do they mostly have a positive or negative impact on the world?

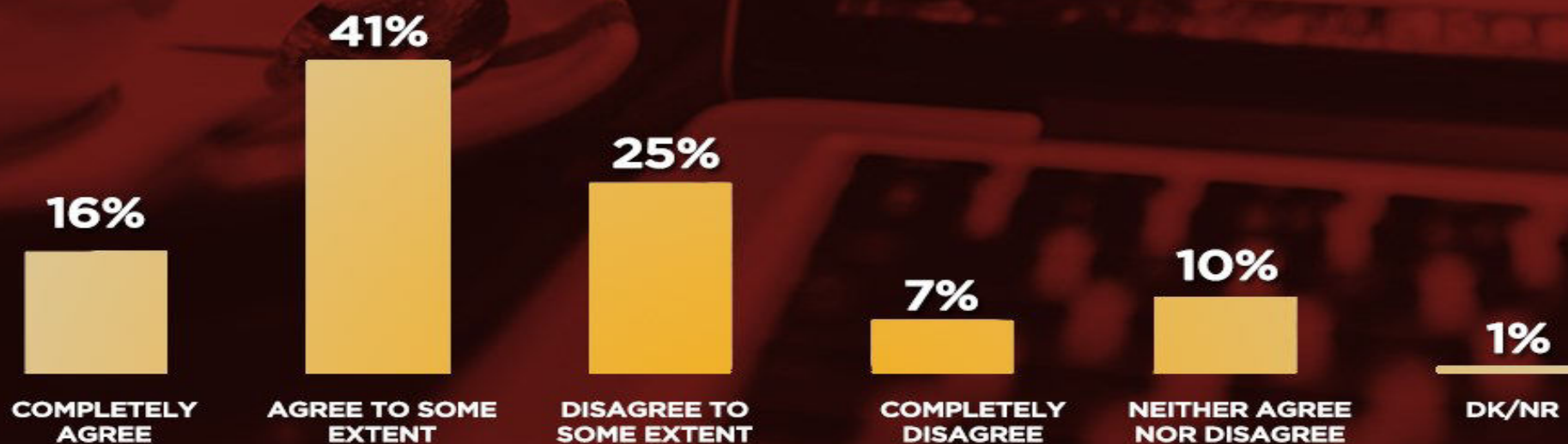

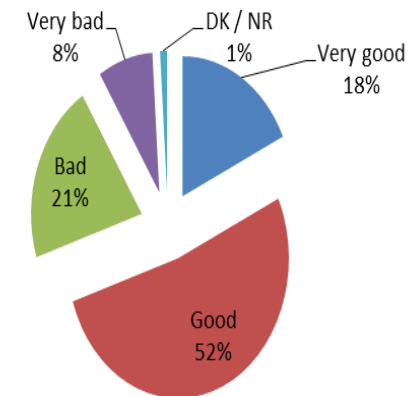

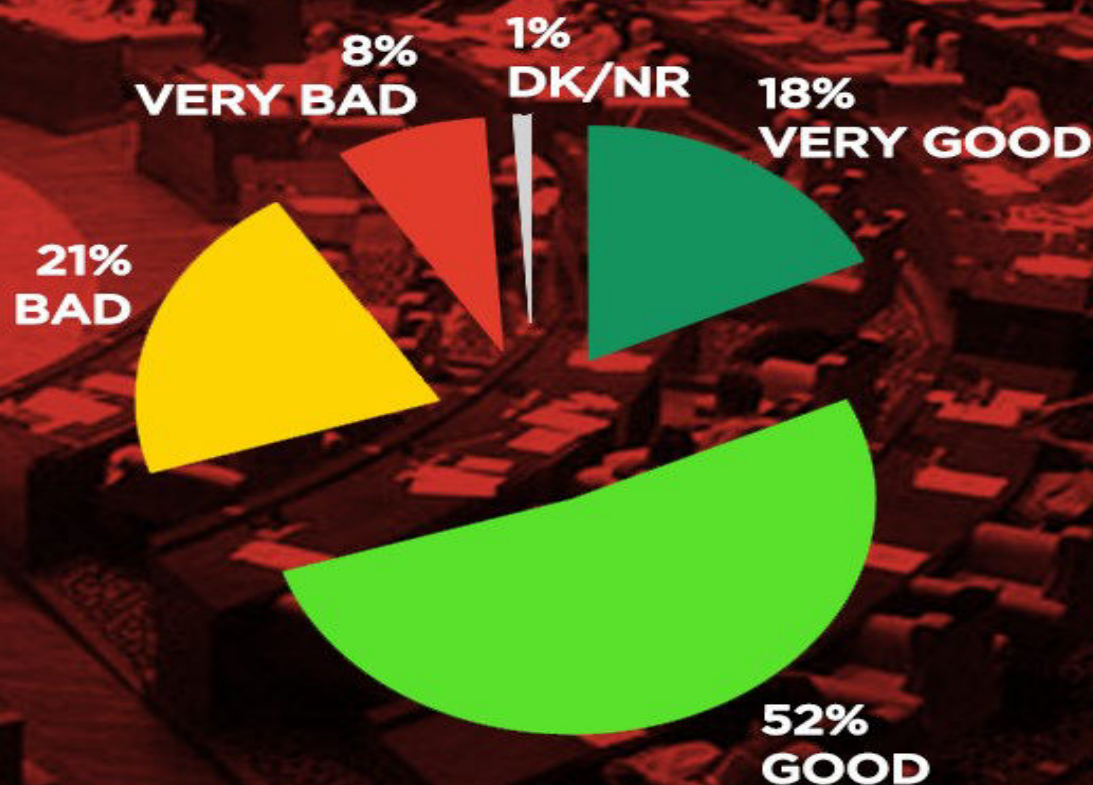

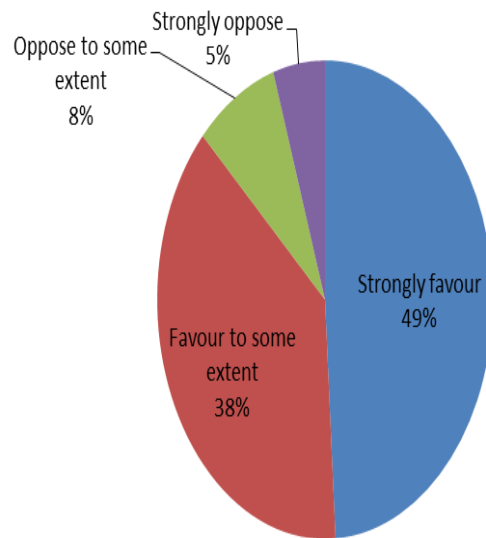
Please tell how you will rate the performance of the recently elected local government/union council?

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 87% Pakistanis favour re-establishment of military courts to improve the law and order situation in the country and eliminate terrorism.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people favour the establishment/ re-establishment of military courts to improve the law and order situation in the country and eliminate terrorism, while some oppose. Please tell to what extent do you personally favour establishment/ re-establishment of military courts?" In response to this question, 49% strongly favour re-establishment of military courts to improve the law and order situation in the country and eliminate terrorism, 38% favour to some extent, 8% oppose to some extent, while 5% strongly oppose.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1833 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 06 – March 13, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

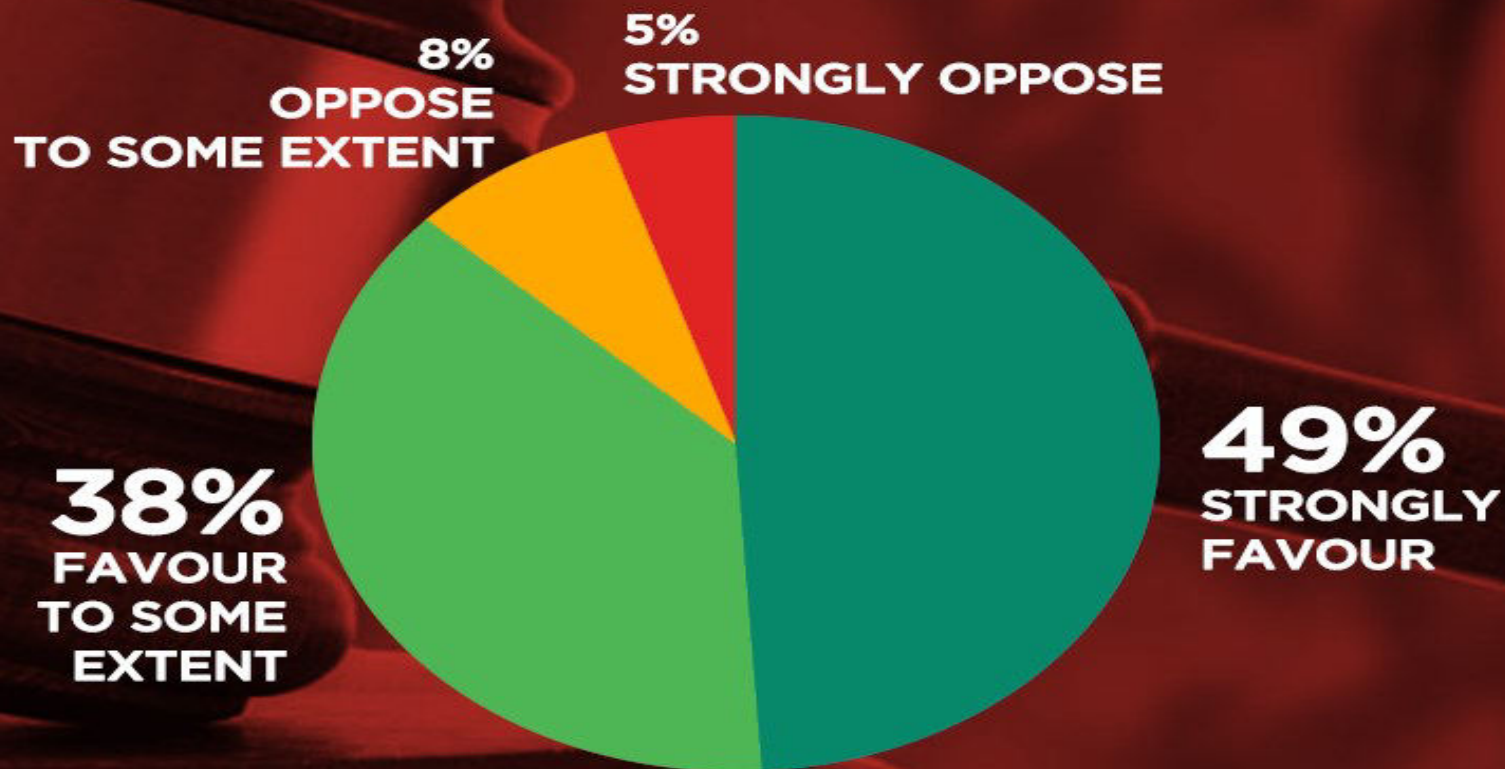

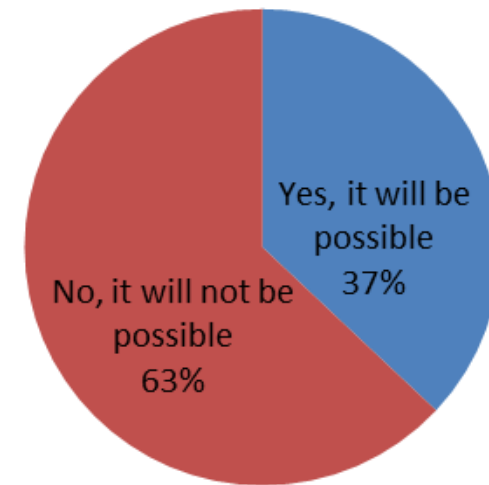
