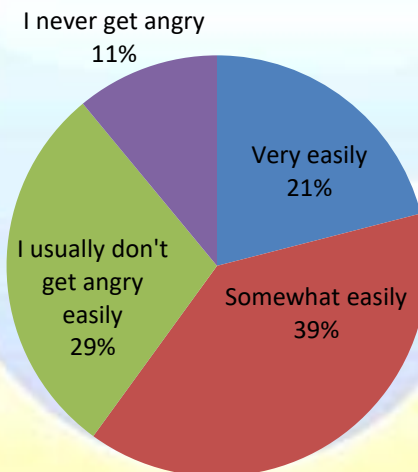
Anger vs Patience: 60% Pakistanis claim they get angry quickly; only 11% say they practice patience. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, May 9, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 60% Pakistanis claim they get angry quickly; only 11% say they practice patience.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people get angry quickly, whereas some are more patient. In your opinion do you get angry easily?” In response to this question, 21% said they get angry very easily, 39% said somewhat easily, 29% said they usually do not get angry easily, while 11% said they never get angry.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 03 – April 10, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
