7 in 10 Pakistanis believe it is essential to adopt societal norms (both good and bad) to succeed in life. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

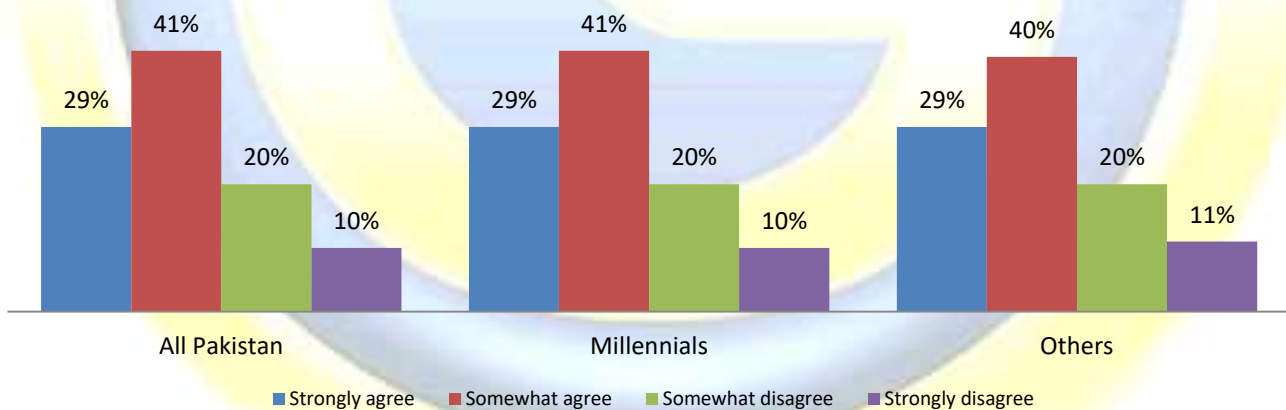
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 7 in 10 Pakistanis believe it is essential to adopt societal norms (both good and bad) to succeed in life.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell if you agree or disagree with the following statements? [To succeed it is necessary to adopt both good and bad societal norms]” In response to this question, 29% said they strongly agree that to succeed it is necessary to adopt both good and bad societal norms, 41% said they somewhat agree, 20% said they somewhat disagree and 10% said they strongly disagree.

Millennials vs Others: No significant difference in the views of millennials

In response to this question, 29% millennial respondents (aged 18-30) said they strongly agree that to succeed it is necessary to adopt both good and bad societal norms, 41% said they somewhat agree, 20% said they somewhat disagree and 10% said they strongly disagree. On the contrary, 29% other respondents (aged 30+) said they strongly agree that to succeed it is necessary to adopt both good and bad societal norms, 40% said they somewhat agree, 20% said they somewhat disagree and 11% said they strongly disagree.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1868 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 08 – May 15, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
