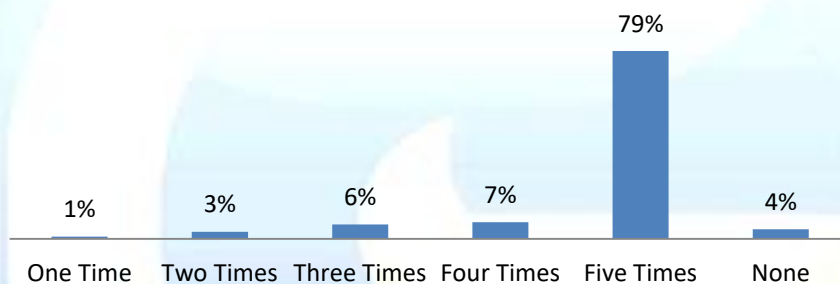
Religiosity surges during Ramadan in Pakistan: 30% more Pakistanis are likely to offer prayers five times a day during Ramadan than other months. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 30% more Pakistanis are likely to offer prayers five times a day during Ramadan than other months.

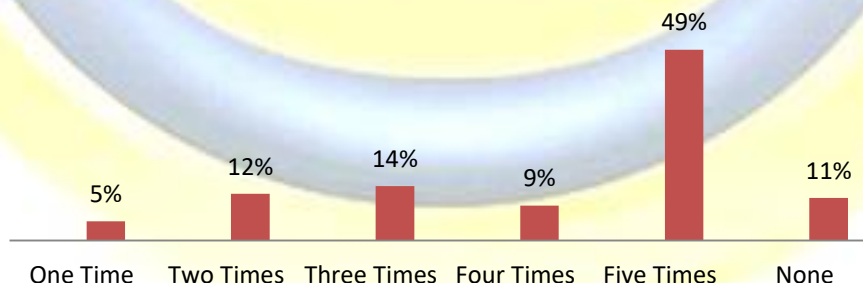
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people get the opportunity to pray whereas others don’t. How many times are you normally able to pray during Ramadan?” In response to this question, 1% said they were able to pray once a day, 3% said twice, 6% said three times, 7% said four times, 79% said five times, while 4% said they have no time to offer prayers.

Question: “Some people get the opportunity to pray whereas others don’t. How many times are you normally able to pray during Ramadan?”



The respondents were further asked, “How many times are you able to pray during months other than Ramadan?” In response to this question, 5% said they were able to pray once a day, 12% said twice, 14% said three times, 9% said four times, 49% said five times, while 11% said they have no time to offer prayers.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1823 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 19 - June 26, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
