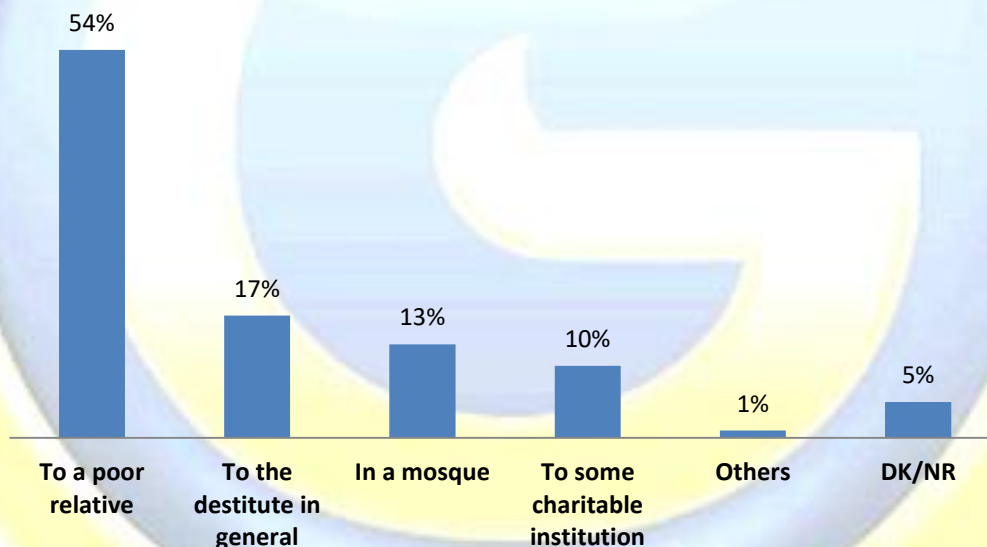
More than half Pakistanis who say they give Zakat, say they give to a poor relative; 10% say they give to a charitable institution. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, July 21, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, more than half Pakistanis who say they give Zakat, say they give to a poor relative; 10% give to a charitable institution.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Who do you give out Zakat to normally?” In response to this question, 54% said they gave Zakat to a poor relative, 17% said to a destitute in general, 13% said in a mosque, 10% said to some charitable institution, 1% said to others. 5% did not know or wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1823 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 19 - June 26, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
