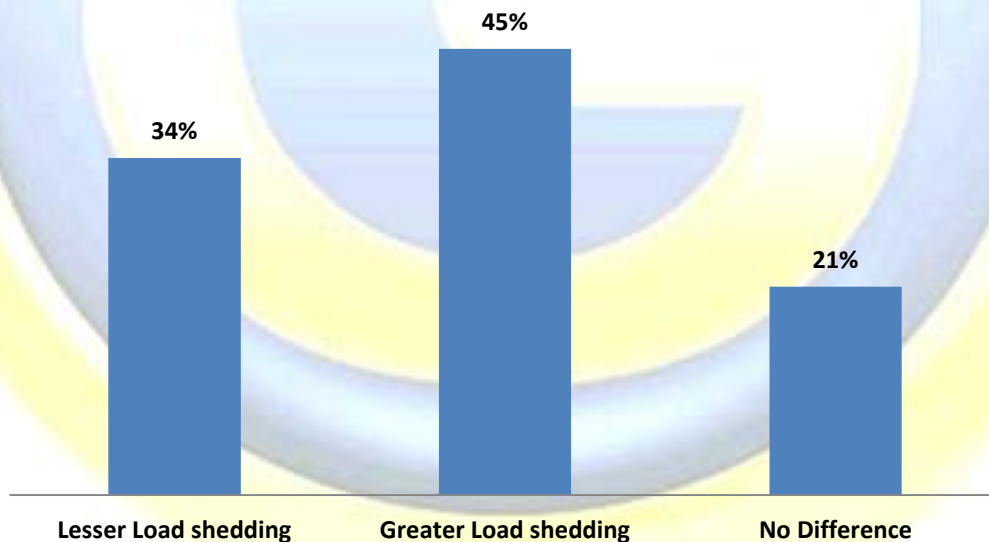
45% Pakistanis opine that load shedding increased during Ramadan this year. 21% say there was no difference. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, July 24, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 45% Pakistanis opine that load shedding increased during Ramadan this year. 21% say there was no difference.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Recall the load shedding during last Ramadan and tell us whether there has been lesser load shedding, greater load shedding or no difference in load shedding this Ramadan in comparison to last year?” In response to this question, 34% said there has been lesser load shedding in comparison to last Ramadan, 45% said there was greater load shedding this time, while 21% said there has been no difference.

Question: “Recall the load shedding during last Ramadan and tell us whether there has been lesser load shedding, greater load shedding or no difference in load shedding this Ramadan in comparison to last year?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1823 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 19 - June 26, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
