



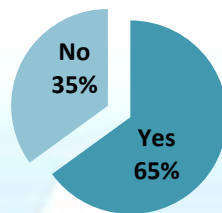

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 1 in 3 Pakistanis have not heard of Parachinar twin blasts around Eid. 43%, who did hear/read of the incident, say that terrorist factions were responsible for the attack; 41% say foreign agencies.

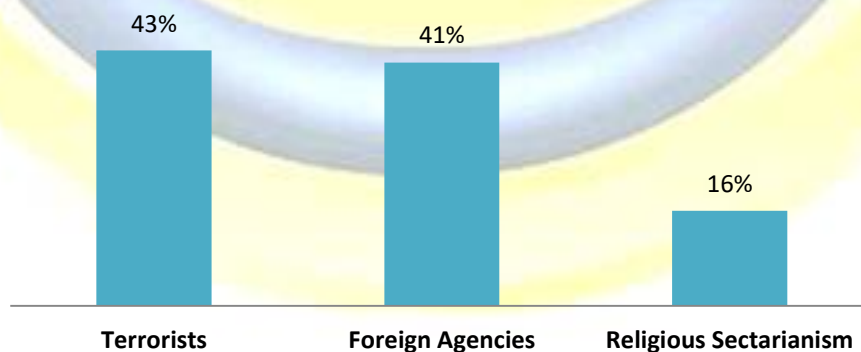
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “Recently in Parachinar near Kurman Bus Station, while people were busy with Eid shopping, there were two blasts one after another in which many people were hurt. Have you read/heard about the attack?” In response to the question, 65% said they had read/heard about the attack, while 35% did not.



Question: “Recently in Parachinar near Kurman Bus Station, while people were busy with Eid shopping, there were two blasts one after another in which many people were hurt. Have you read/heard about the attack?”

Respondents who answered in the affirmative were further asked, “Who do you think is responsible for the attack?” In response to the question, 43% Pakistanis said terrorist were responsible for the attack, 41% said foreign agencies, while 16% opined that religious sectarianism was responsible for the tragedy.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1790 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 03 - July 10, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm$ 2-3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
