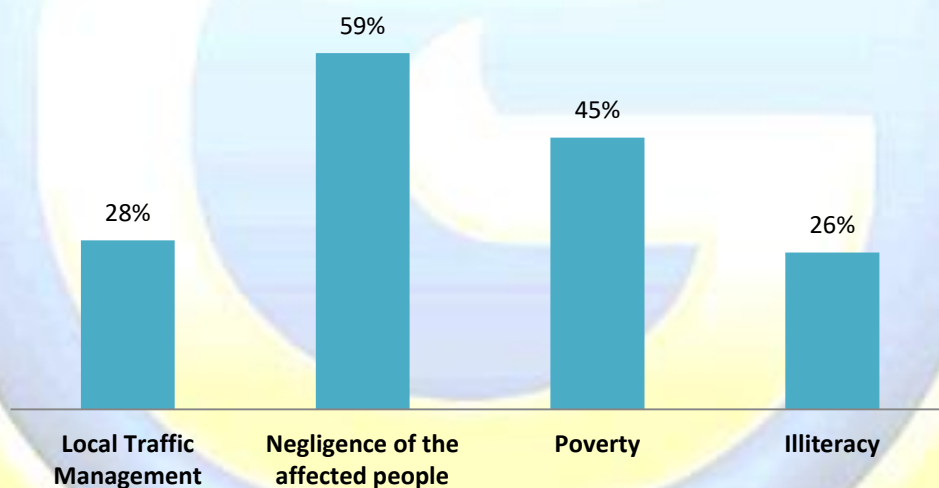

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, Ahmedpur Oil Tanker Fire: 59% Pakistanis who had heard or read about the incident, opined that the negligence of the affected people resulted in the tragedy, while 45% said poverty.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who had read/heard about the Ahmedpur oil tanker fire were further asked, “Who do you think is responsible for the tragedy?” In response to the question, 28% Pakistanis said local traffic management was responsible, 59% blamed the negligence of the affected people, 45% said poverty and 26% said illiteracy.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1431 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 03 - July 10, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
