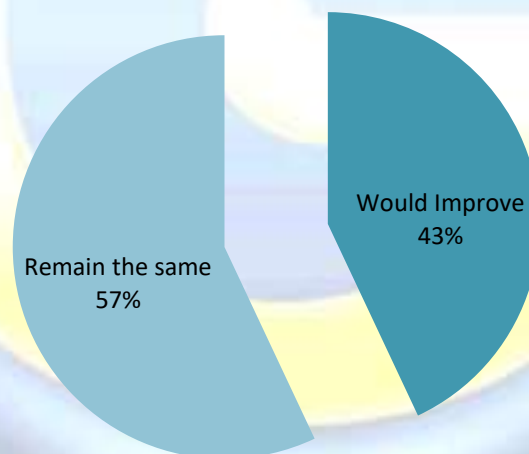
57% Pakistanis are pessimistic about improvement in government's performance given an increase in revenue. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, July 3, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 57% Pakistanis are pessimistic about improvement in government's performance given an increase in revenue.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Suppose if the government collects more taxes, would its performance and administration improve, or would it remain the same despite an increase in the revenue?" In response to this question, 43% said that the government's performance and administration would improve if it collects more taxes, whereas 57% said that it would remain the same.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1786 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 22 – May 29, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
