



Opinion Poll Government Policies Budget

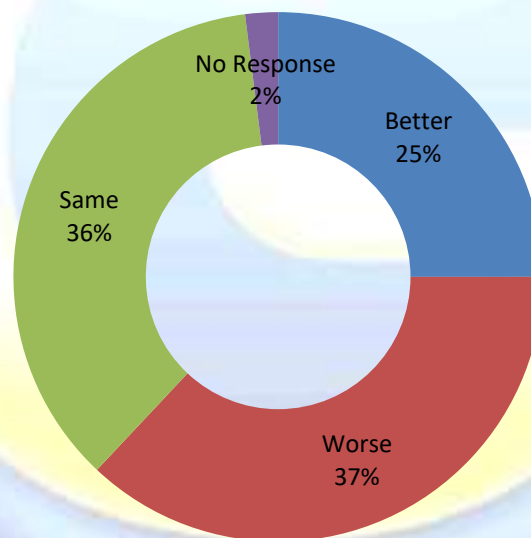
37% Pakistanis opine that the budget for fiscal year 2017-2018 is worse than the previous budgets; 36% say it is the same as the previous years. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, July 7, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 37% Pakistanis opine that the budget for fiscal year 2017-2018 is worse than the previous budgets; 36% say it is the same as the previous years.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, is the latest budget presented for fiscal year 2017-2018 better, worse or the same as last year?” In response to this question, 25% said it was better, 37% said it was worse and 36% said it was the same. 2% did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1800 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 29 – June 5, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
