Post Panama Case Political Scenario: 3 in 5 Pakistanis believe that Nawaz Sharif's disqualification would be the most beneficial for Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf.

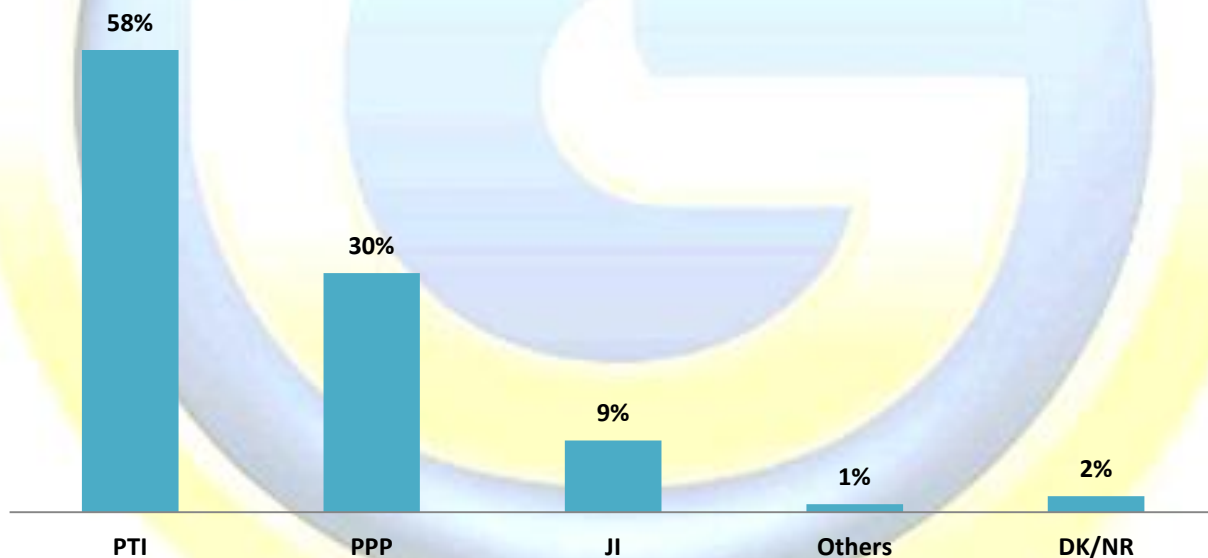

Islamabad, August 16, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup and Gilani Pakistan, 3 in 5 Pakistanis believe that Nawaz Sharif's disqualification would be the most beneficial for Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "In your opinion, the disqualification of PM Nawaz Sharif would be the most beneficial for which party?" Responding to this, 58% said PM Nawaz Sharif's disqualification would be the most beneficial for PTI, 30% said PPP, 9% said JI, 1% named some other party and 2% did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1795 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 31 - August 7, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
