A significant majority of Pakistanis (89%) believe that Pakistan has indeed progressed (a lot or somewhat) since its Independence 70 year ago.

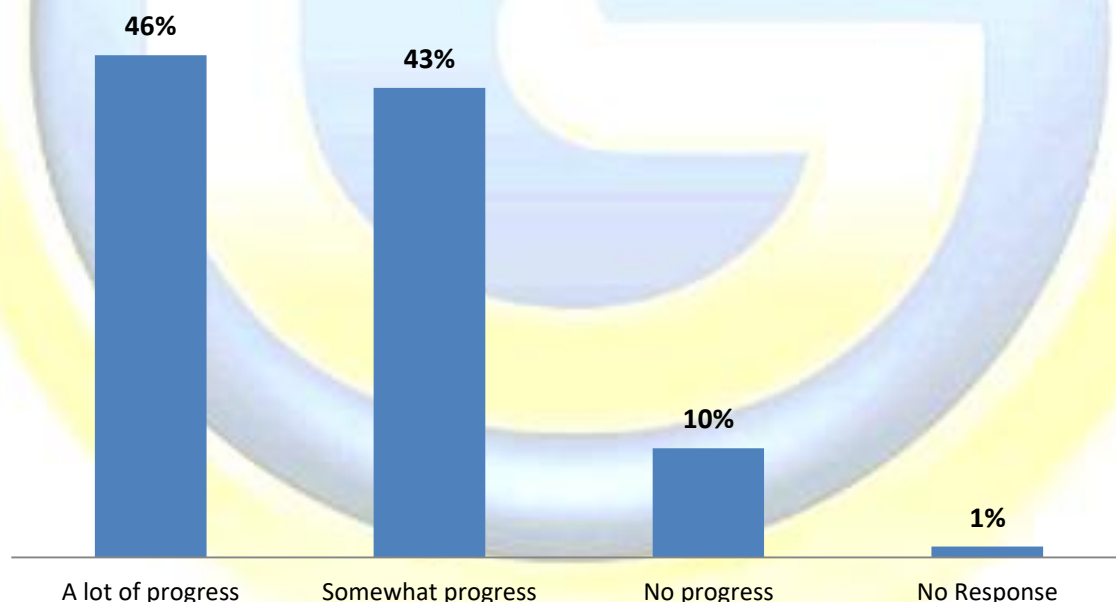

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a significant majority of Pakistanis (89%) believe that Pakistan has indeed progressed (a lot or somewhat) since its Independence 70 year ago.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people believe that since its Independence, Pakistan has made a lot of progress in the last 70 years, some people believe that Pakistan has progressed somewhat, while others think that Pakistan has absolutely made no progress. What is your opinion?” In response, 46% opined that Pakistan has progressed a lot since its independence, 43% said it has somewhat progressed, 10% said there has been no progress and 1% did not know or wish to respond.

Question: “Some people believe that since its Independence, Pakistan has made a lot of progress in the last 70 years, some people believe that Pakistan has progressed somewhat, while others think that Pakistan has absolutely made no progress. What is your opinion?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1794 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 21 – August 28, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
