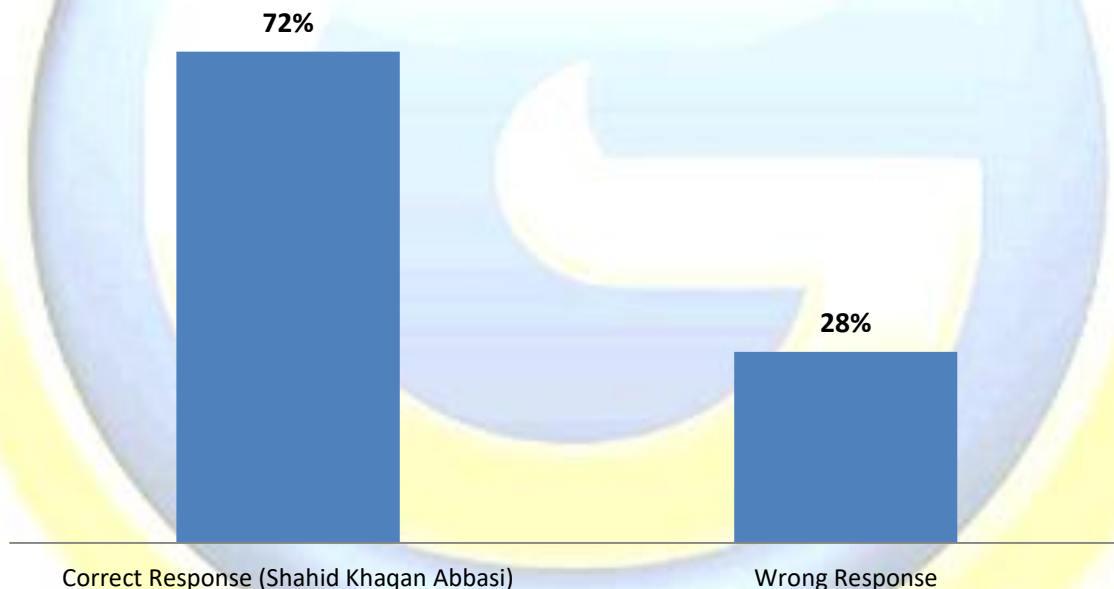
**Nearly 1/3rd Pakistanis unable to correctly name current Prime Minister of Pakistan.
(GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

Islamabad, September 22, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 1/3rd Pakistanis unable to correctly name current Prime Minister of Pakistan.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Please tell us what the name of the current Prime Minister of Pakistan is.” In response, 72% Pakistanis correctly named the Prime Minister of Pakistan (Shahid Khaqan Abbasi) while 28% gave an incorrect answer.

It should be noted that the survey was conducted soon after the new PM sworn in. The recall of PM's correct name may improve in subsequent months.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1794 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 21 – August 28, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
