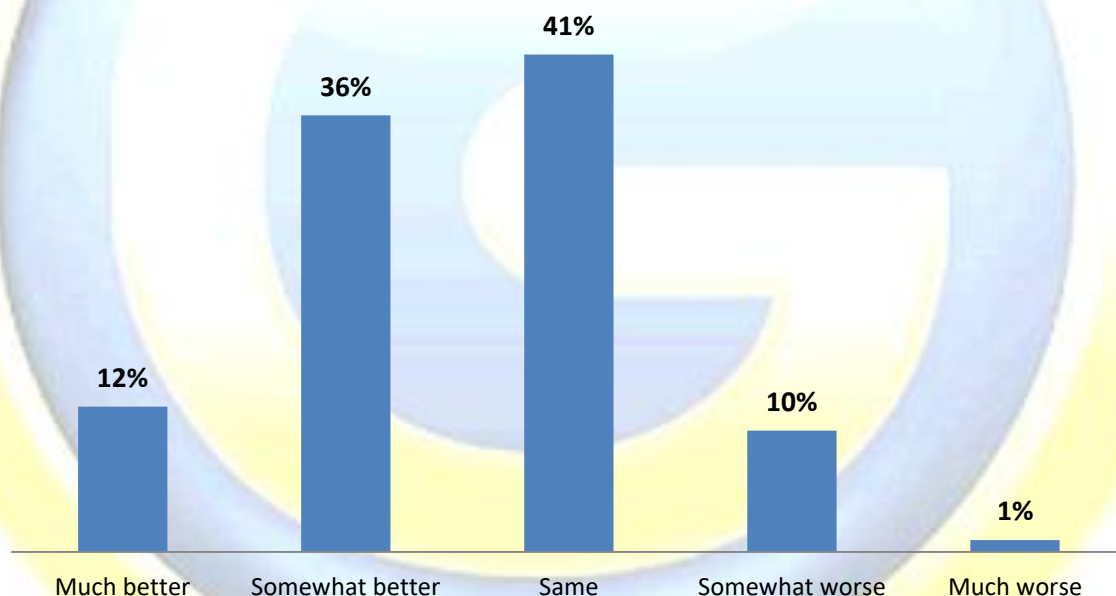
**Nearly half Pakistanis (48%) are hopeful that their economic conditions will improve (much better/somewhat better) in a year.
(GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

Islamabad, September 26, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly half Pakistanis (48%) are hopeful that their economic conditions will improve (much better/somewhat better) in a year.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “What do you think your economic conditions will be like one year from now as compared to today?” In response, 12% said they would be much better, 36% said somewhat better, 41% said same, 10% said somewhat worse and 1% said much worse.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1797 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 4 – September 11, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
