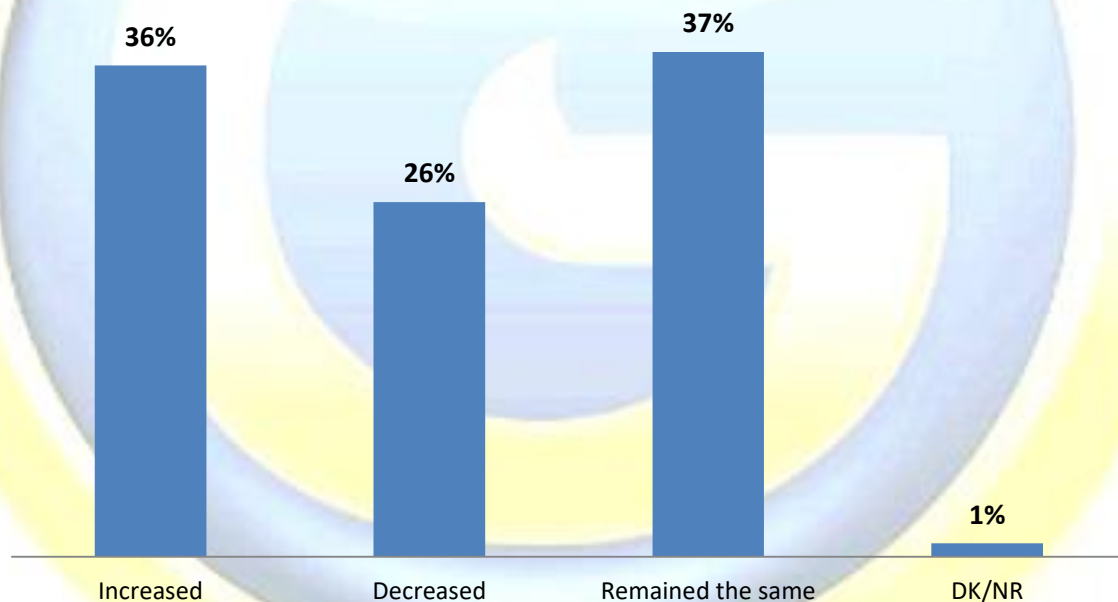
**36% Pakistanis opine that the number of people offering sacrifice of animals has increased this year compared to previous years.
(GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

Islamabad, September 28, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 36% Pakistanis opine that the number of people offering sacrifice of animals has increased this year compared to previous years.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your opinion, has the number of people giving sacrifice of animals this year increased, decreased or remained the same as previous years?” In response, 36% said it had increased, 26% said it had decreased and 37% said it remained the same this year. 1% did not know or wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1797 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 4 – September 11, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
