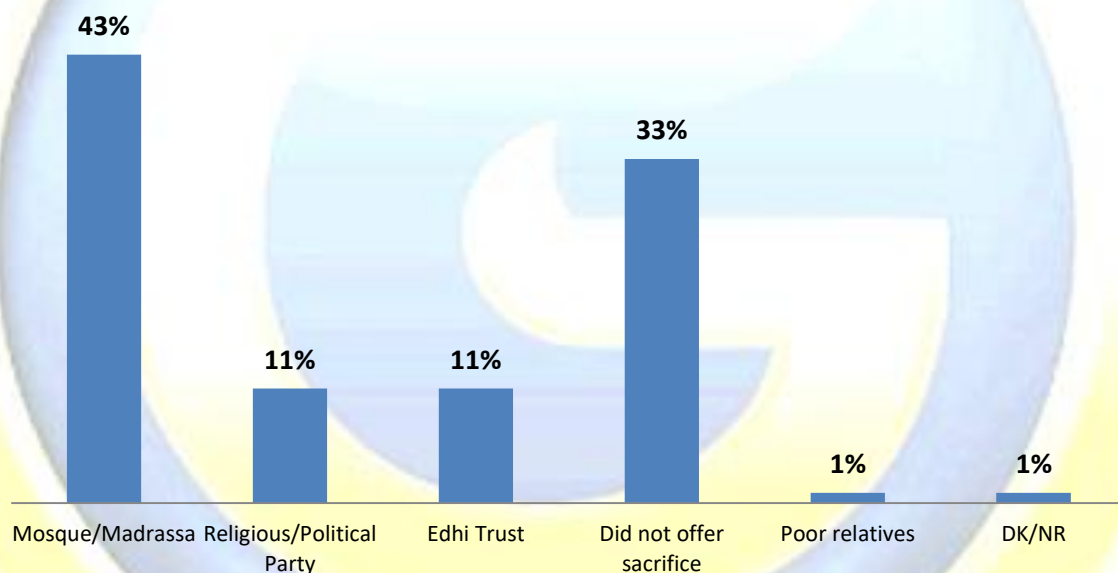
4 in 10 Pakistanis say they gave the hides of the sacrificial animal to a mosque/madrassa this Eid. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, September 29, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 4 in 10 Pakistanis say they gave the hides of the sacrificial animal to a mosque/madrassa this Eid.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “This year, who did you give the hides of the sacrificial animal to?” Responding to this, 43% said to a mosque/madrassa, 11% said to a religious/political party, 11% said to Edhi trust, 33% said they did not offer sacrifice, 1% said to poor relatives and 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1797 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 4 – September 11, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
