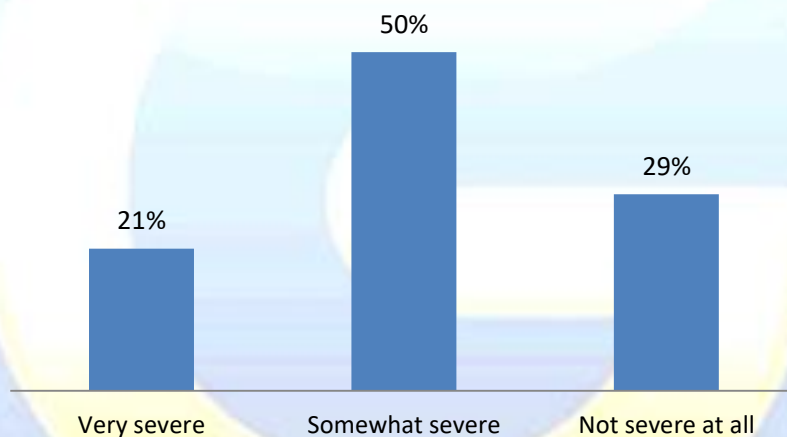
**Gas Load Shedding: 71% Pakistanis cite gas load shedding to be a severe problem (very or somewhat) in their area.
(GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

Islamabad, October 18, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 71% Pakistanis cite gas load shedding to be a severe problem (very or somewhat) in their area.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who answered in the affirmative about having domestic gas supply was further asked, “How severe is the problem of gas load shedding in your area?” In response to this question, 21% said the problem of gas load shedding is very severe, 50% said somewhat severe and 29% said not severe at all.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1285 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, September 18 - September 25, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
