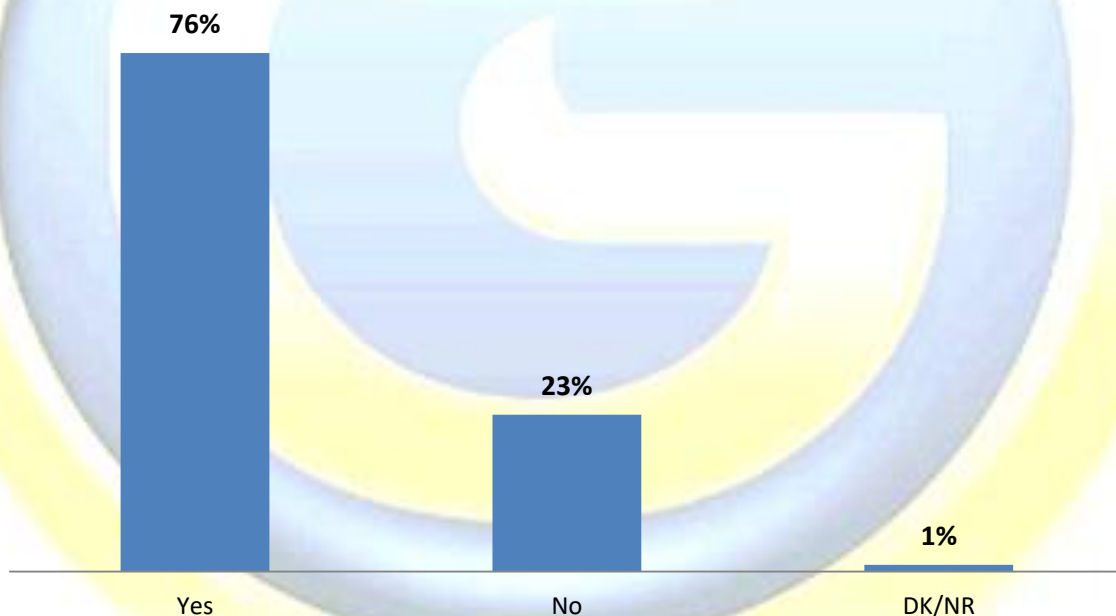
**1 in 5 Pakistanis say they are unaware about the Rohingya Muslims issue in Burma.
(GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

Islamabad, October 2, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 5 Pakistanis say they are unaware about the Rohingya Muslims issue in Burma.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “For the past few years, almost eight lakh inhabitants of western Burma, who neither had basic human rights nor citizenship rights have been allegedly persecuted by the Burmese government. Have you read/heard something about this?” In response, 76% said yes they did know about it while 23% said no. 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1781 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, September 11- September 18, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
