**3 in 5 Pakistanis (58%) opine that the one dish ban on wedding feasts should remain enforced. 42% say otherwise.
(GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)**

Islamabad, October 31, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 3 in 5 Pakistanis (58%) opine that the one dish ban on wedding feasts should remain enforced. 42% say otherwise.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Some people believe that the one dish ban on wedding feasts should be lifted, others say that it should be maintained/stay enforced. What is your opinion about it?” In response, 42% said it should be lifted, while 58% said it should remain enforced.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1752 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, September 25 – 01 October, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
