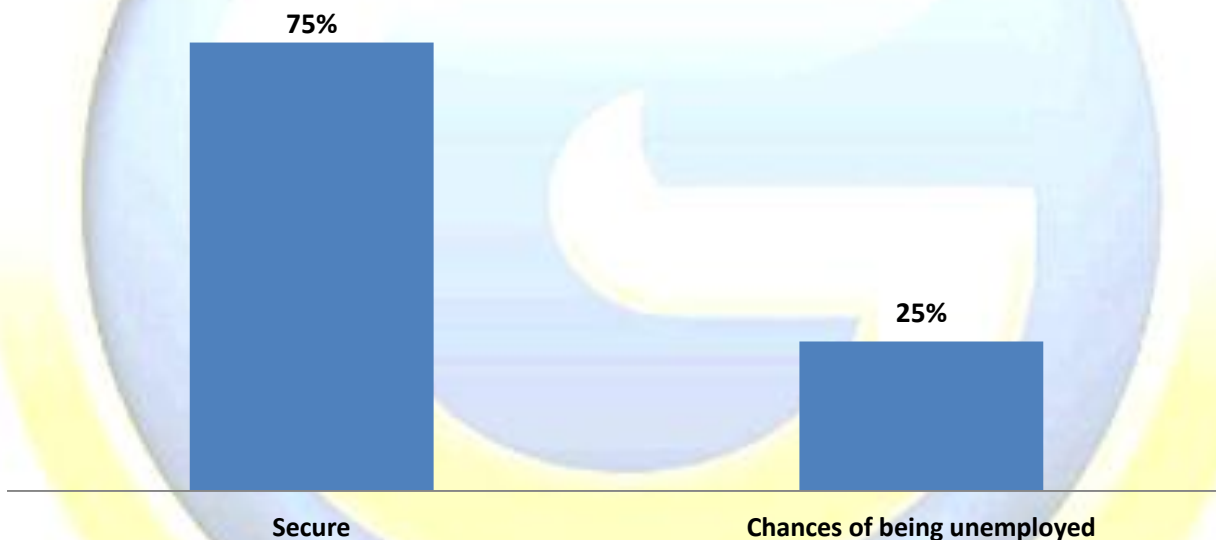
1 in 5 employed Pakistanis perceive their current employment to be insecure. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

Islamabad, November 6, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 5 employed Pakistanis perceive their current employment to be insecure.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Do you think your current job is secure or is there a possibility that you could be unemployed soon?” In response to this question, 75% said their job was secure, while 25% said there were chances of being unemployed.

Bilal I Gilani, Executive Director at Gallup Pakistan adds: “Job insecurity measured by this opinion poll is an important indicator of economic health of a nation as well as an early warning predictor of economic problems ahead. A quarter of employed Pakistanis feelings insecure about their jobs is a concerning figure. Gallup plans to track this question and findings in future as well.”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1752 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, September 25 – October 01, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
