1 in 4 Pakistanis opine that the influence of religion among the people is decreasing.

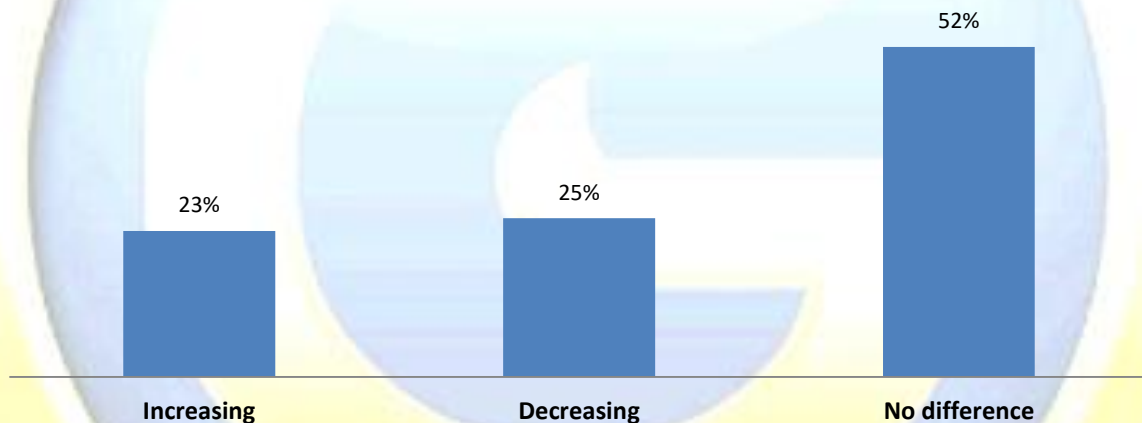

Islamabad, November 15, 2017

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 4 Pakistanis opine that the influence of religion among the people is decreasing.

A nationally representative sample of men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, is the influence of religion increasing or decreasing on people in Pakistan?” In response to this question, 23% respondents said that the influence of religion is increasing on people in Pakistan, 25% said that the influence of religion is decreasing, while 52% said that there has been no difference in the influence of religion.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1746 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, October 09 - October 16, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
