3 in 5 Pakistanis (57%) say they do not trust (very little/not at all) the political parties.

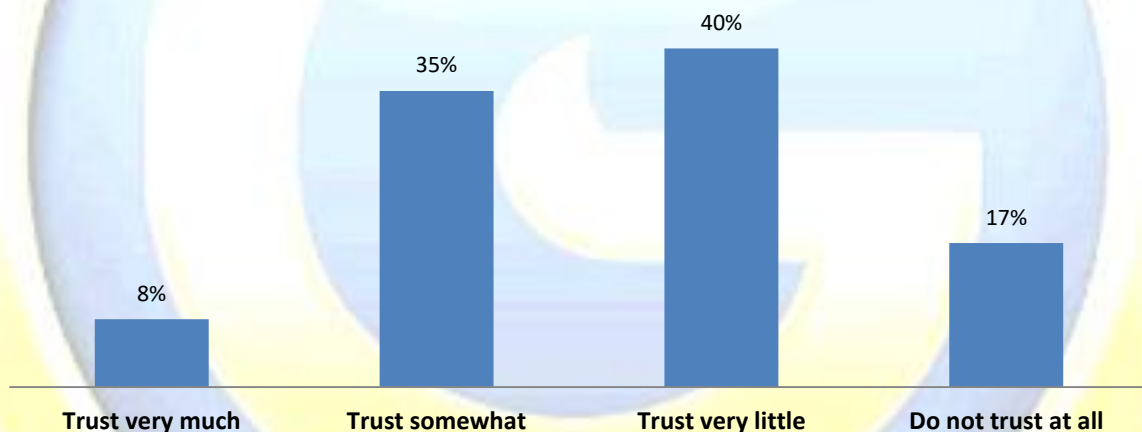

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 3 in 5 Pakistanis (57%) say they do not trust (very little/not at all) the political parties.

A nationally representative sample of men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “We want to know your opinion about some institutions. Please tell us how much do you trust the following institutions? *Political Parties*” In response to this question, 8% respondents said they trust the political parties very much, 35% said they somewhat trust political parties, 40% said they trusted them very little, while 17% said they have no trust in political parties at all.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1746 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, October 09 - October 15, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
