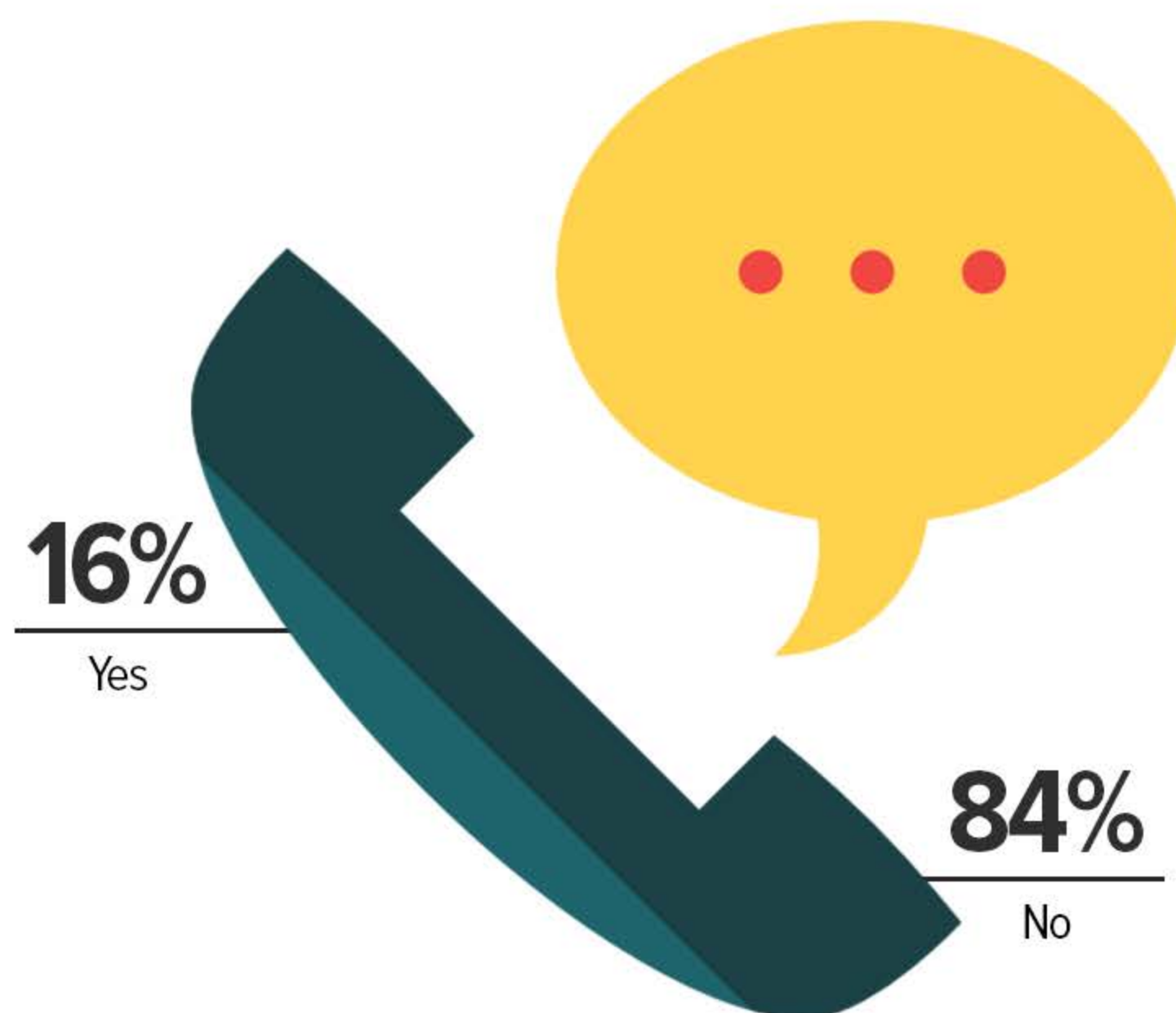

16% Pakistani women claim to have been victimized by unwanted and harassing phone calls.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 16% Pakistani women claim to have been victimized by unwanted and harassing phone calls.

A nationally representative sample of women from across the four provinces was asked, “Have you ever experienced the following; Receiving prank calls or wrong number phone calls which did not stop despite your protest” In response to this question, 16% said yes and 84% said no.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 857 women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, November 05 –November 11, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
