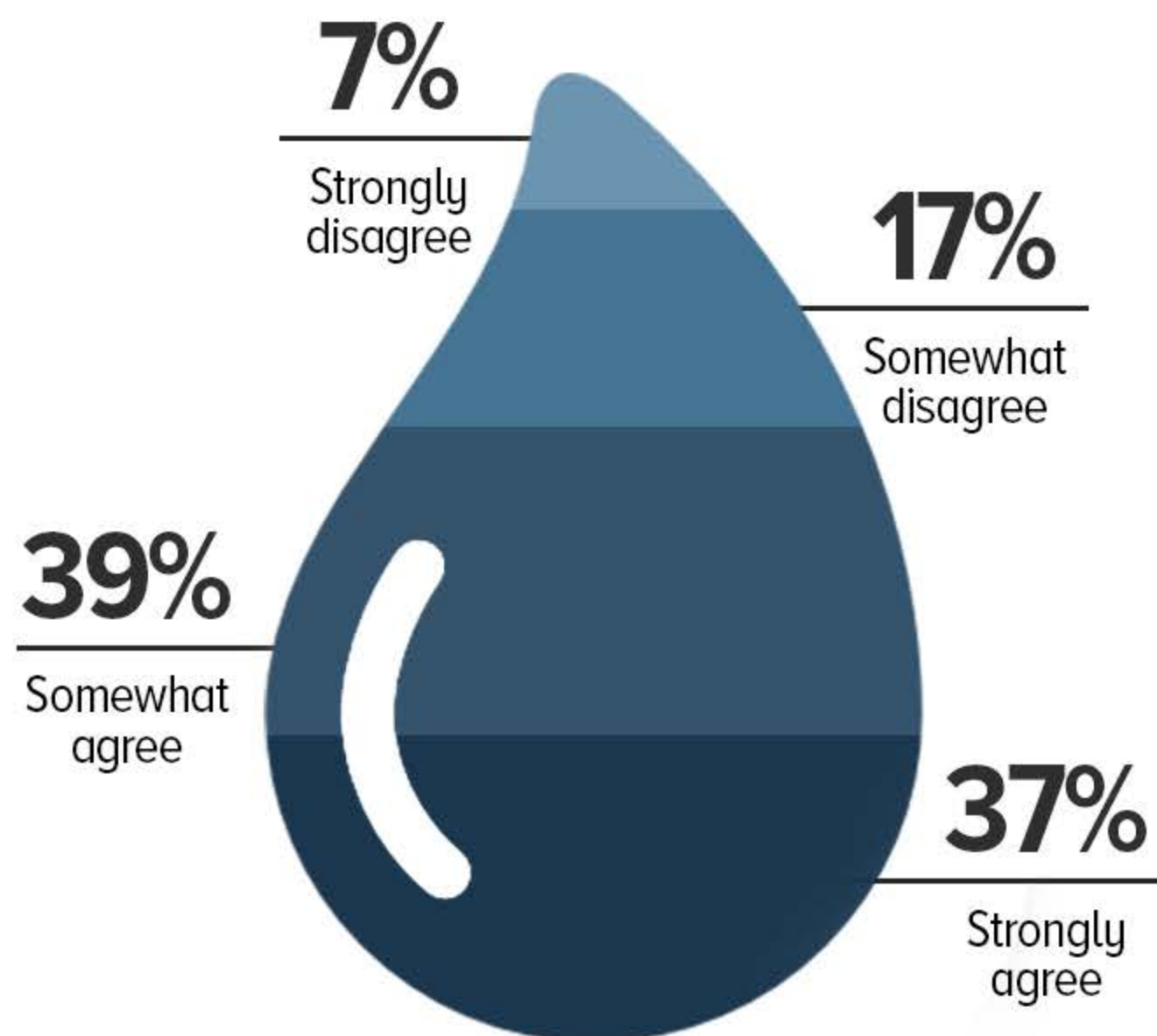

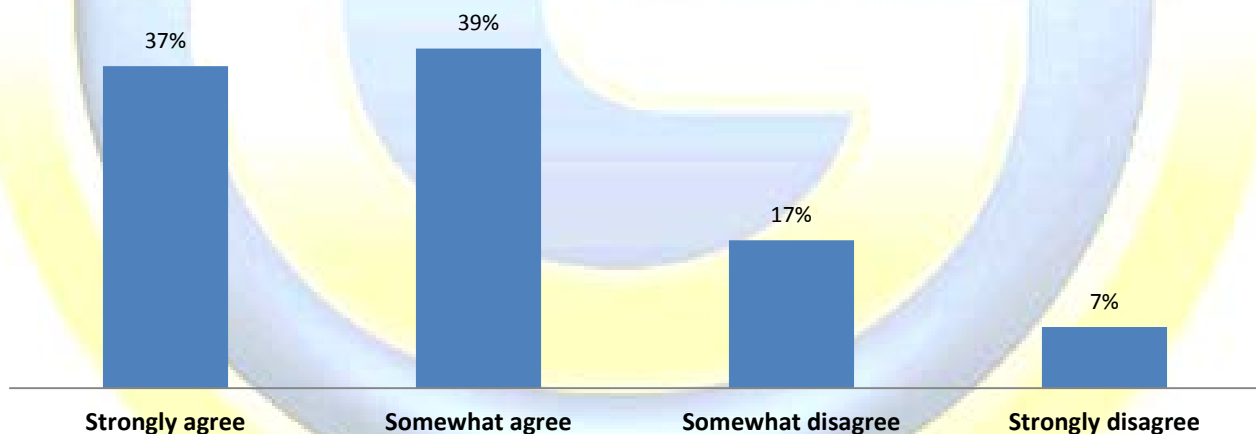

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a significant majority of Pakistanis (76%) opine that the quality of drinking water in the country is unsatisfactory and causes health problems.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please let us know how much do you agree with the following statement? The quality of drinking water is not satisfactory and causes health problems” In response to this question, 37% said they strongly agreed, 39% said they somewhat agreed, 17% said they somewhat disagreed and 7% said they strongly disagreed.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1776 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, October 16 – October 23, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
