According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 48% married Pakistani women say they never call their husband by his first name.

A nationally representative sample of married women from across the four provinces was asked, “In some communities of our society, it is custom that wives never call their husbands by their name. Please tell me whether you call your husband by his name or not?” In response to this question, 52% said yes, we call our husband by his name and 48% said no we do not call our husband by his name.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 734 women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, October 16 – October 23, 2017. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
