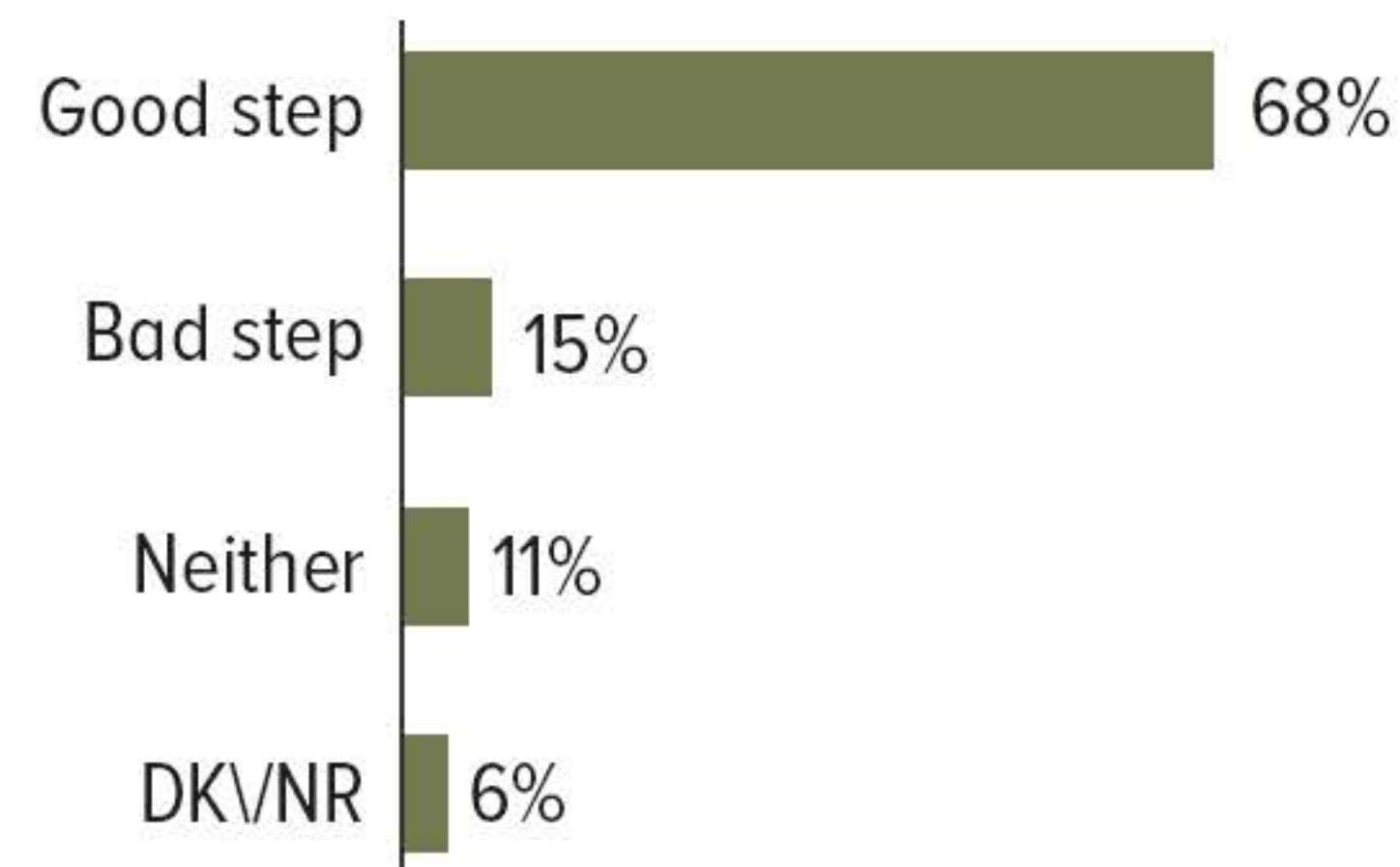

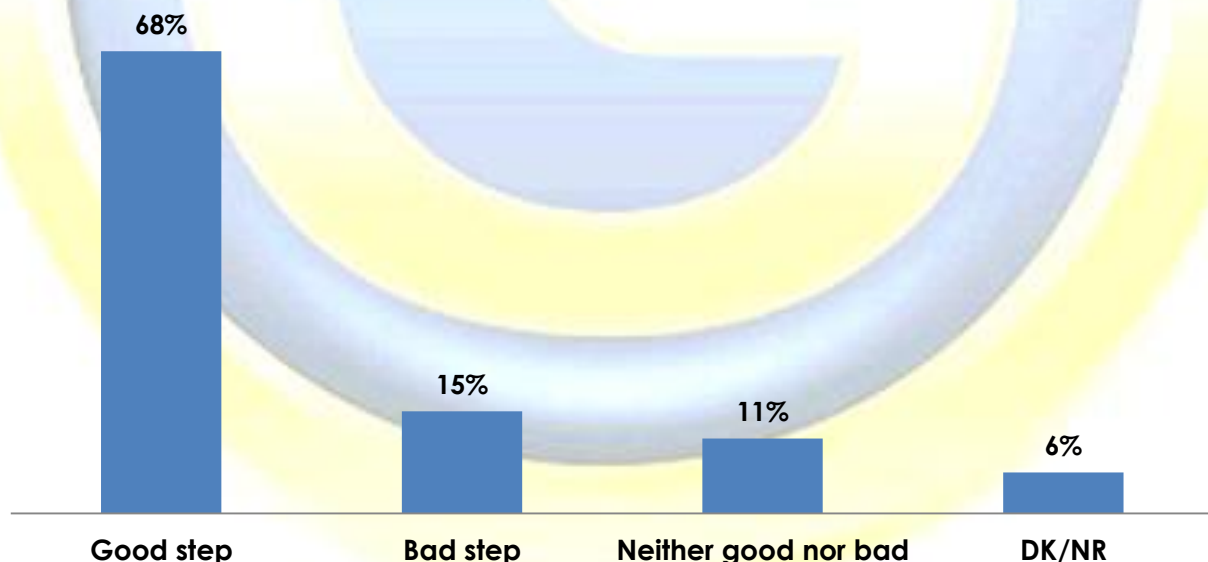

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, more than two third Pakistanis (68%) believe it a good step by the Punjab government to introduce a booklet on child safety in the curriculum.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Recently, Punjab government has decided to spread awareness on children's safety and protection from abuse by introducing a new booklet. To what extent do you feel, this is a good step by the Punjab Government?” Responding to this, 68% said it is a good step, 15% said it is a bad step, 11% said neither good nor a bad step and 6% did not wish to give a response.

Question: “Recently, Punjab government has decided to spread awareness on children's safety and protection from abuse by introducing a new booklet. To what extent do you feel, this is a good step by the Punjab Government?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1710 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, February 12 –February 19, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
