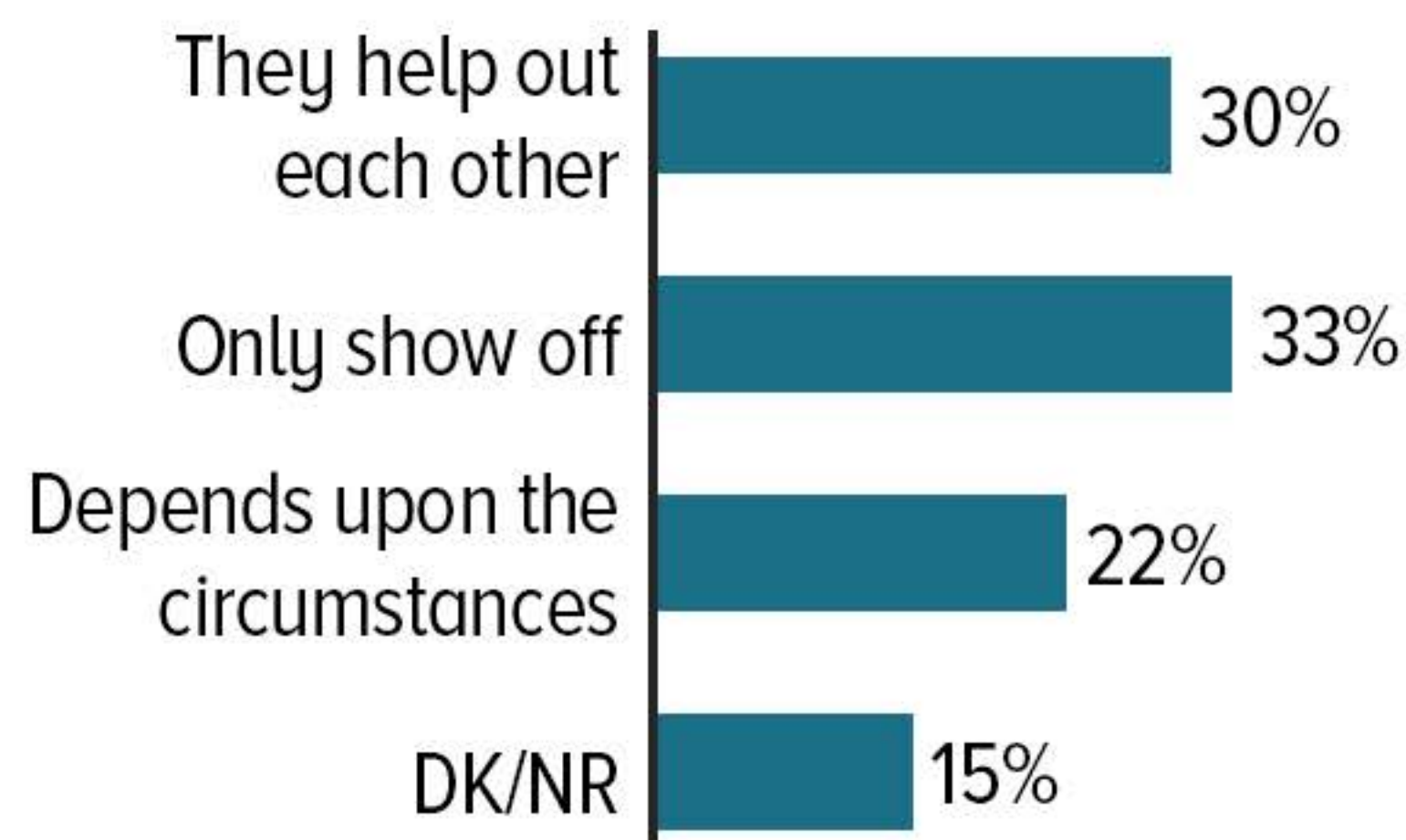

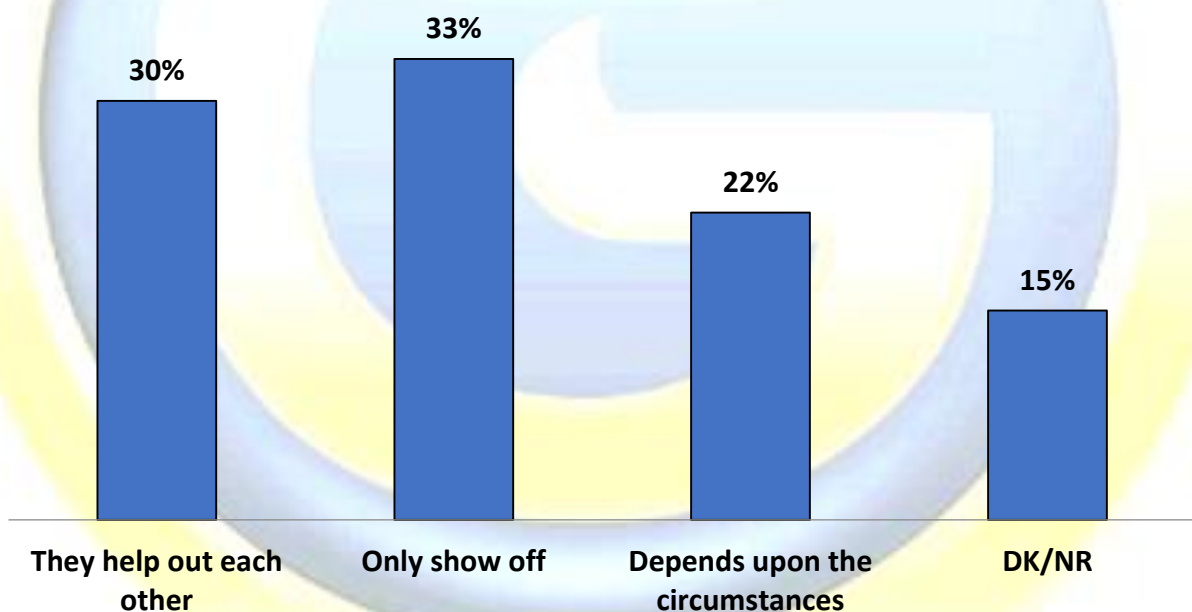
**One third Pakistanis (33%) believe that people display helpful attitudes only to show off.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, one third Pakistanis (33%) believe that people display helpful attitudes only to show off.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Keeping in mind the circumstances of today, do you think most people try to help each other or just show off?” In response to this question, 30% said they help each other, 33% said they only show off, 22% said depends upon the circumstances and 15% did not know or wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1654 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, February 05- February 09, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
