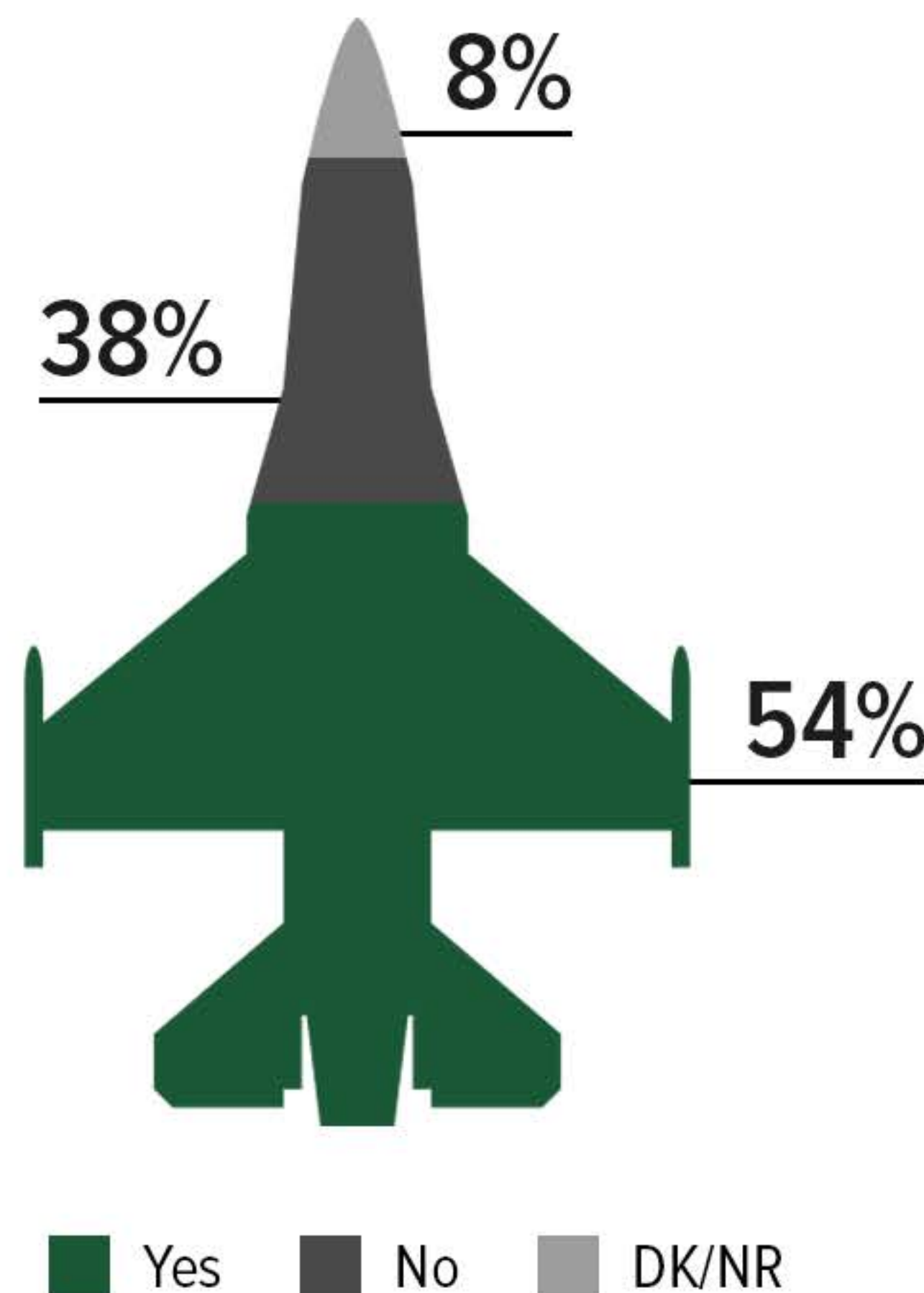

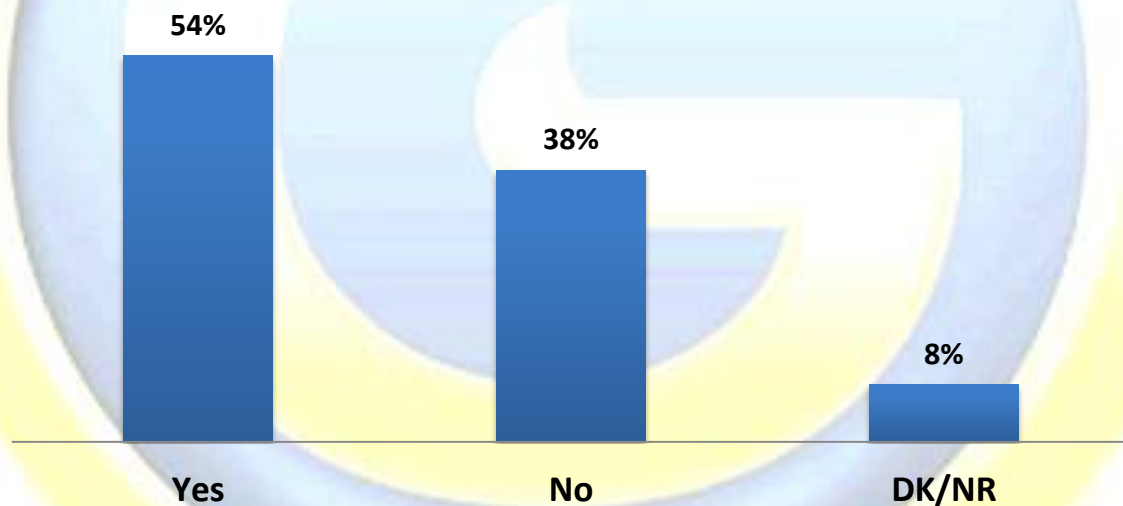
More than 1 in 2 Pakistanis (54%) say they saw the Pakistan Day parade this year. (GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, more than 1 in 2 Pakistanis (54%) say they saw the Pakistan Day parade this year.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “On the occasion of the 78th Pakistan Resolution Day, the Pakistani armed forces demonstrated a splendid parade in Islamabad where warfare equipment was also displayed. Please tell us if you had the chance to watch the parade this time?” In response to this question, 54% said yes they saw the parade and 38% said no. 8% did not know or wish to respond.

Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
