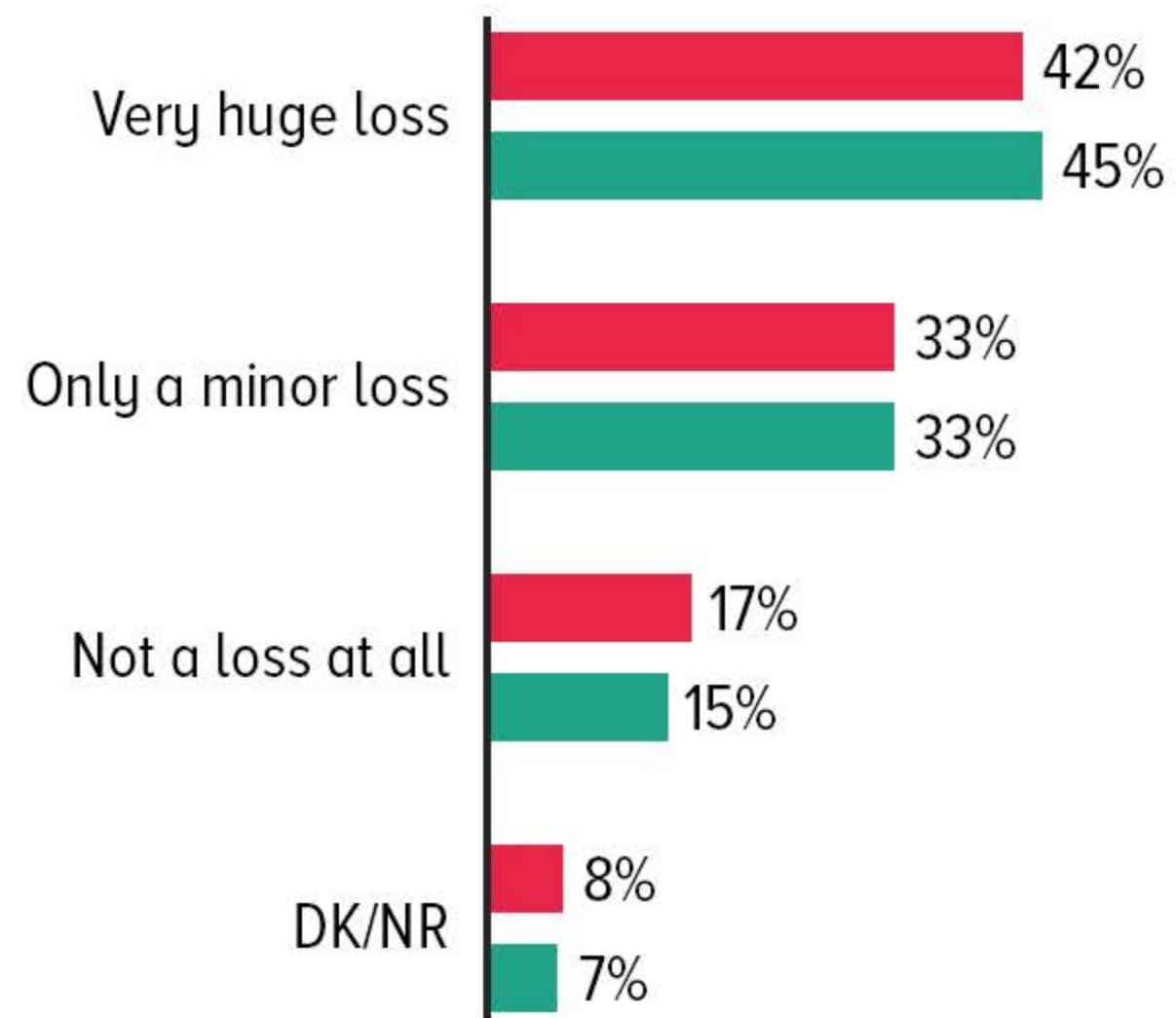

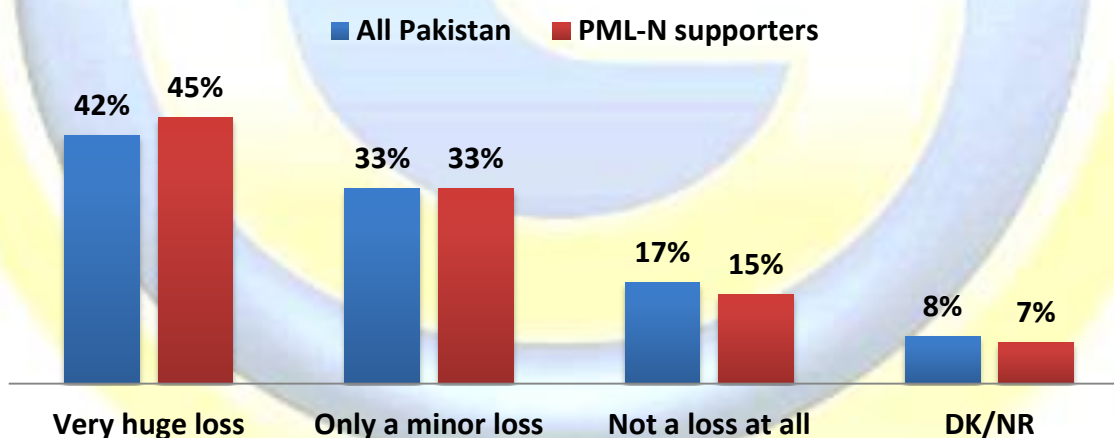

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 2 in 5 Pakistanis (42%) believe that Chaudhry Nisar leaving PML-N would be a huge loss for the party. 45% PML-N supporters opines the same.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people believe that Chaudhry Nisar leaving PML-N would be a huge loss for the party. Others think that Chaudhry Nisar leaving PML-N would only be a minor loss for PML-N. Yet some others also say that Chaudhry Nisar leaving PML-N would not harm the party at all. What is your opinion about it?” In response to this question, 42% said very huge loss, 33% said only a minor loss and 17% said it would not be a loss at all. 8% did not know or wish to respond.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1581 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, April 16- April 23, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
