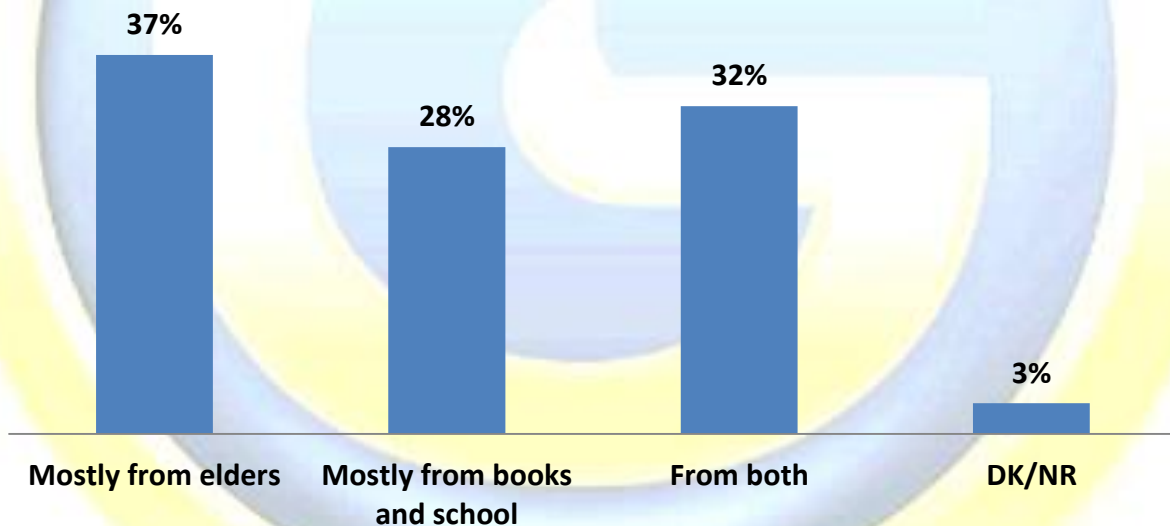

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 2 in 5 Pakistanis (37%) opine that a child learns most from elders; 32% say that elders and books/school both play a key role.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people believe that whatever a child learns comes mostly from elders, whereas others think a child learns mainly from books and school. What is your opinion?” In response to this question, 37% said children learn mostly from elders, 28% said mostly from books and school, while 32% said both. 3% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1672 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, April 23- April 30, 2018. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.
